Plan to Mitigate spread of COVID-19

Prevention

Have you experienced any of the following symptoms that indicate a possible COVID-19 infection?

- Temperature of 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth;
- Sore throat;
- Loss of taste and smell;
- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (or, for students with a chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline);
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain; or
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever.

Please answer **YES or NO**.

2. Have you had close contact with any individual who is lab-confirmed with COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

Close contact is defined as:

- Being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g., being coughed on); or
- Being within 6 feet for a cumulative duration of 15 minutes;

If either occurred at any time in the last 14 days at the same time the infected individual was infectious.

Please answer **YES or NO**.

Screening protocol for students

Send out letter/Swift k12/Remind in English and Spanish with pre-screening questions listed

Bus (Temperature, hand sanitizer)

Carpool riders enter at west entrance

Walkers enter at west entrance

Teacher follow morning/afternoon duty schedule. Some assignments to ride bus.

Screening protocol for staff

Enter through back/staff parking lot door

Answer screening questions

Take temperature and record

Attest to self-screen and sign in

Screening protocol for visitors

Enter through front office door

Wear mask

Answer self-screening questions if visit is **not** brief

Cannot pass the front desk/Door to Mr. Miller's office

Mitigation

- Masks are to be worn at all times in hallways by all people. Social distancing 6 ft apart.
- Students are to walk in single file lines down hallway maintaining a 3 ft distance.
- Water fountains are for water bottles only. Teacher depresses button while student fills bottle. Teacher wipes off faucet after use. Water pitchers filled and delivered to classrooms at breakfast.

School entry/exit procedures

Students exit one bus at a time wearing masks.

Staff member on duty holds open the door.

Students go straight to class. They can stop to put backpack in locker. Must maintain distance.

Breakfast served in classrooms (delivered by cafeteria staff).

Upon student arrival at class door, teacher squirts hand sanitizer into palm of each student.

At end of each class (before bell), teachers hand out wipes to students and students sanitize desks with wipe; without wipe, the teacher sprays solution for student to wipe with paper towel.

The teacher wipes the doorknobs and light switch of classrooms frequently during day.

If going outside, teacher holds door for students to exit and then wipe the doorknob with wipes provided.

At end of day, there is no re-entry for students. Teacher on duty holds door open and then wipes doorknob when done.

Lunch

Everyone wears a mask while walking to lunch.

Students wash hands for 20 seconds in restroom before going to lunch.

Lunches are staggered by grade and/or teacher.

All Students enter cafeteria on the west side (by the gym).

All Students exit cafeteria on the east side (by secondary library).

Students sit by class. Chairs and tables are distanced.

Students stand 3 feet apart facing forward in line to get food.

Masks/Face Shields

All people wear masks on bus, in hallways, and while not participating in a physical activity. In classrooms, masks may be removed if 6 ft of social distancing is maintained.

Students bring their own water bottles.

Zipper pouch provided for 3rd, 4th, 5th grade supplies (hopefully donated).

Hygiene

Students wash hands before lunch (and after if necessary) and at each restroom break.

Teachers squirt hand sanitizer in students' palms upon entry into each classroom during day.

Teachers wash hands and use hand sanitizer regularly.

Janitorial Services

Teachers collect trash at end of day and set outside of classroom.

Teachers wipe doorknobs and light switches often throughout day.

Teachers distribute wipes to students at end of each class to sanitize desks and chairs.

Custodians maintain cleanliness of restrooms throughout day while vacuuming and mopping spaces.

The Electostatic sprayer will be used in each classroom once a week on a daily rotation.

If you notice a need in a restroom, text Mr. Miller and he will speak to custodian.

Response

If student complains during day of any of the symptoms below:

- Temperature over 100 – flushed, sweaty palms,
- Sore throat,
- Loss of taste and smell,
- Uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing,
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain,
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever,

Then, send student to Superintendent's office.
