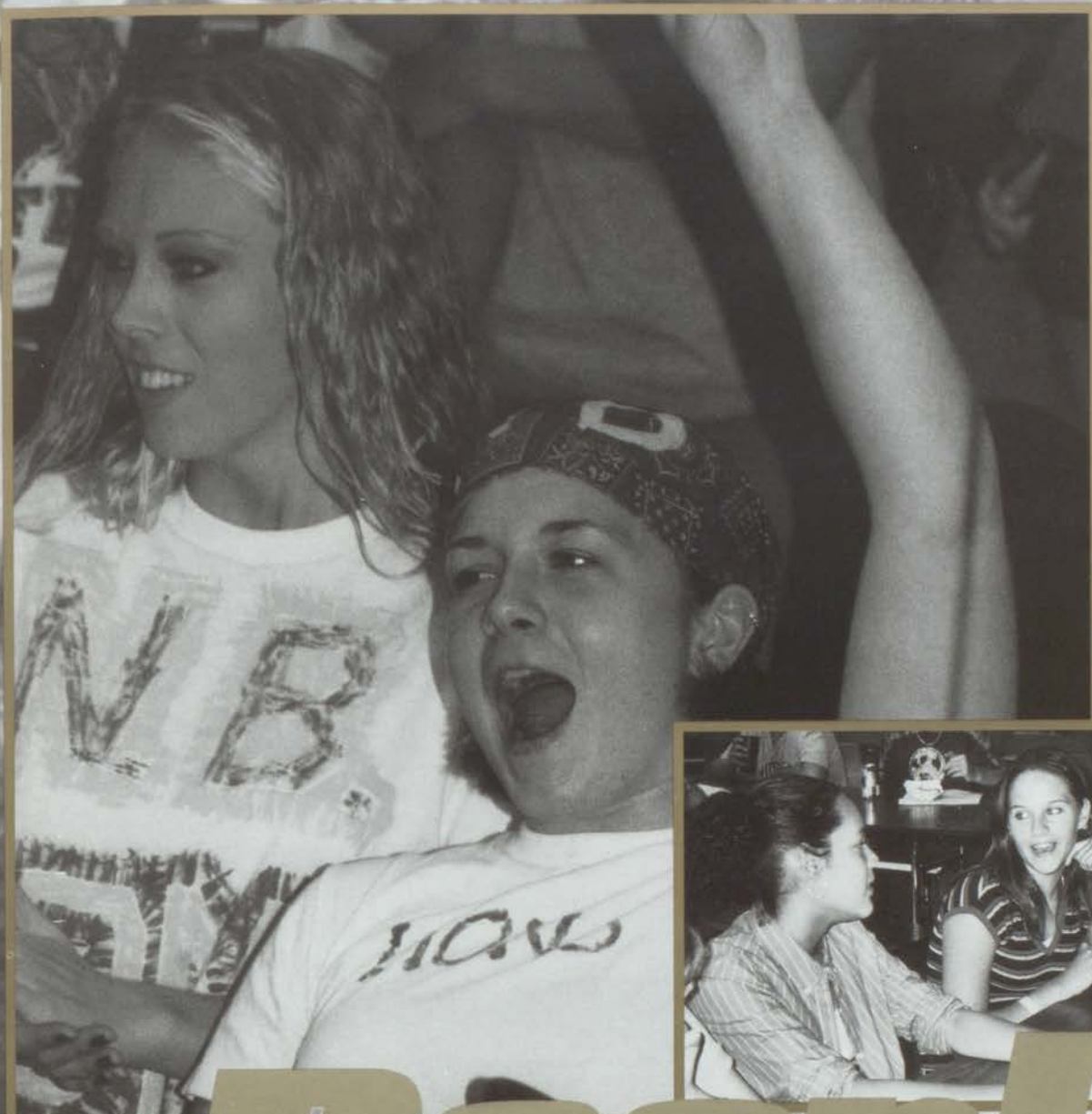

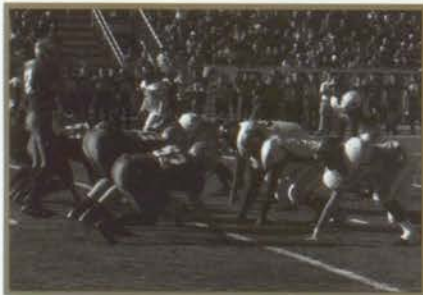
NB VS. MT. VERNON 18-13

Until 1941, the state of Texas required just first through eleventh grades for graduation. In 1941, they went to a 12 grade system.

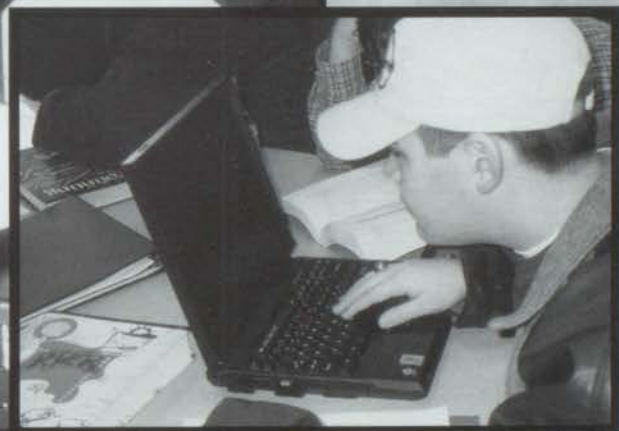

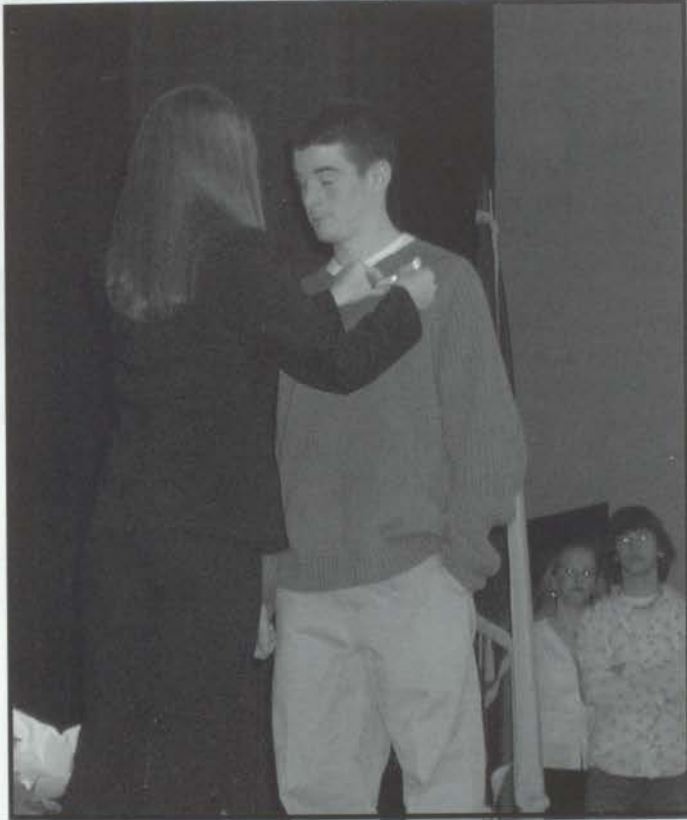

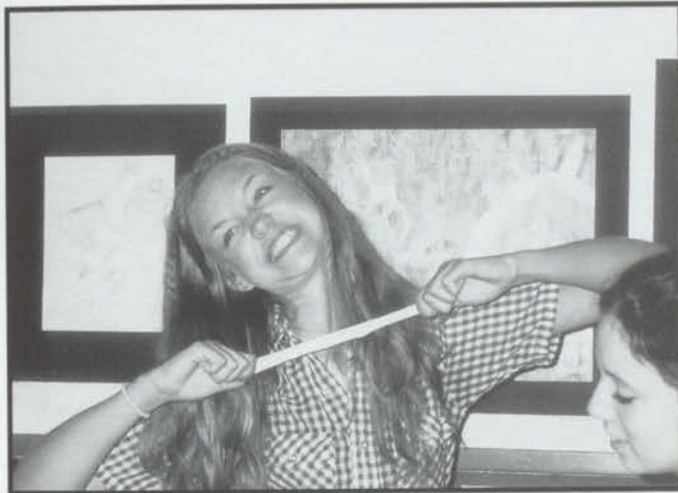

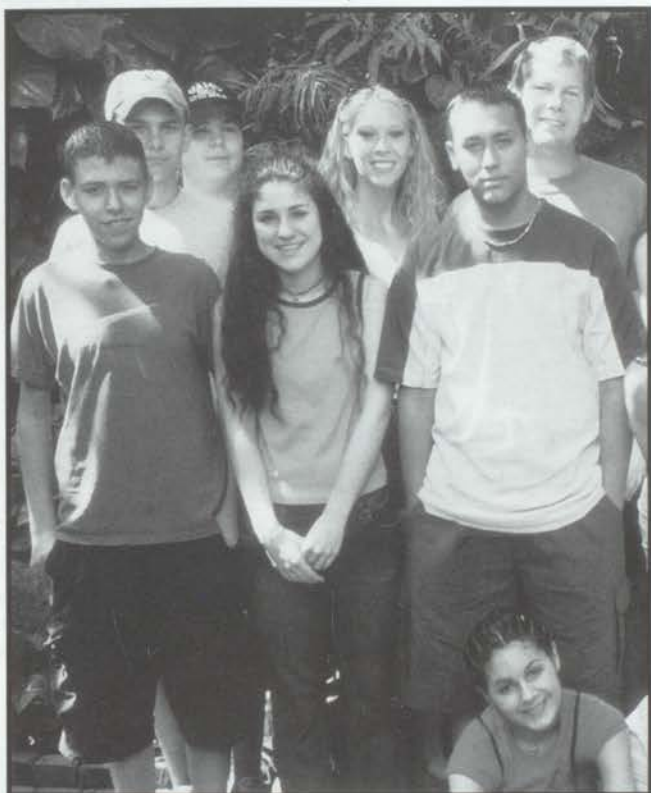

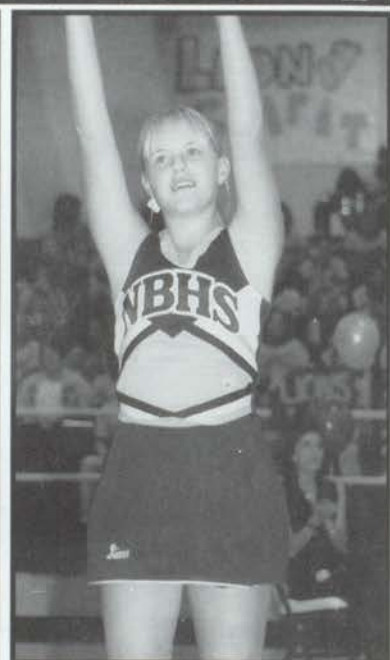

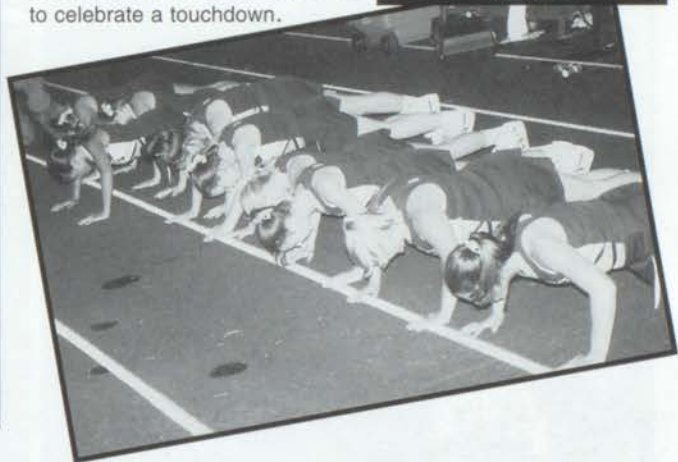

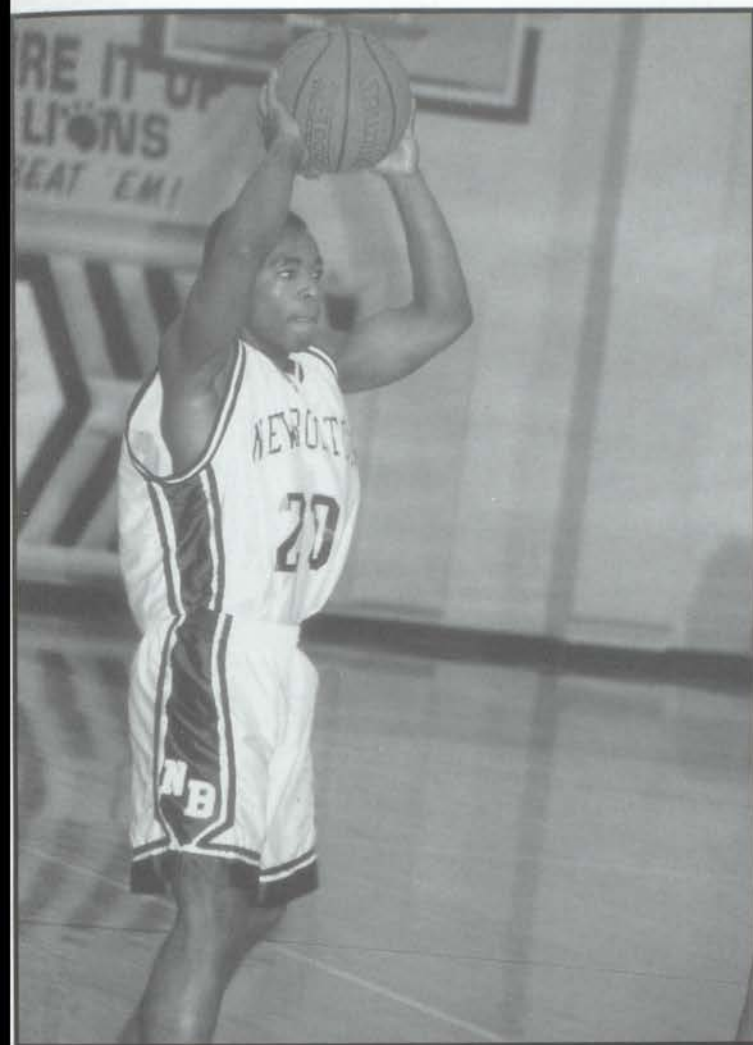

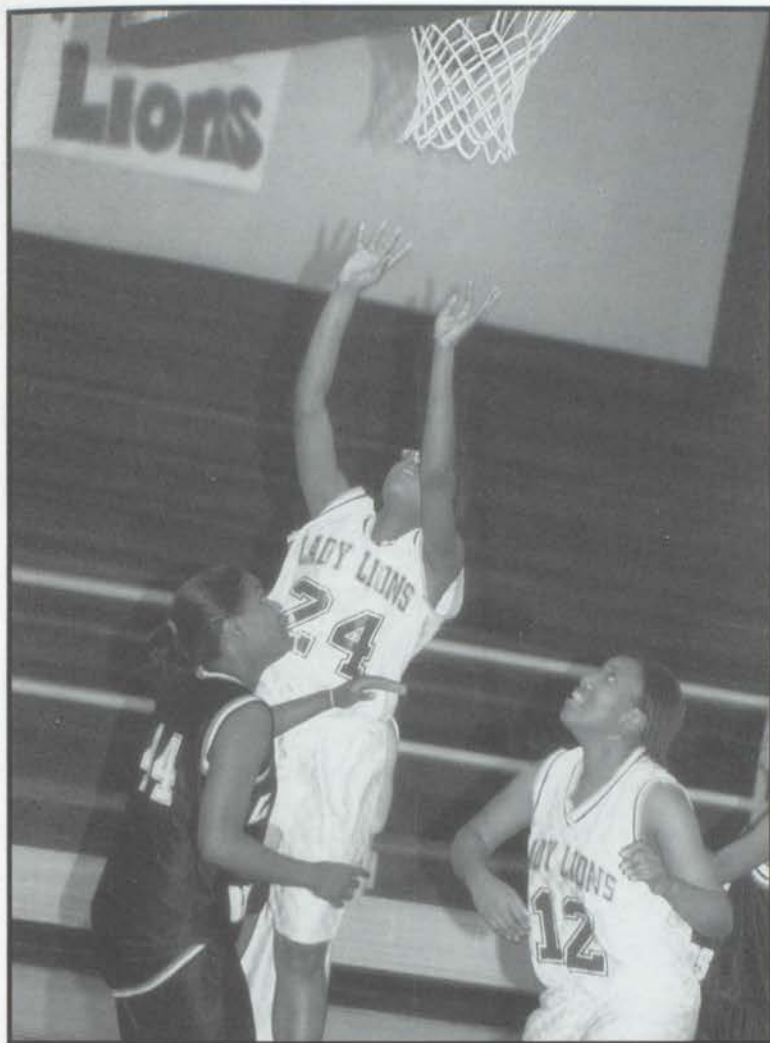

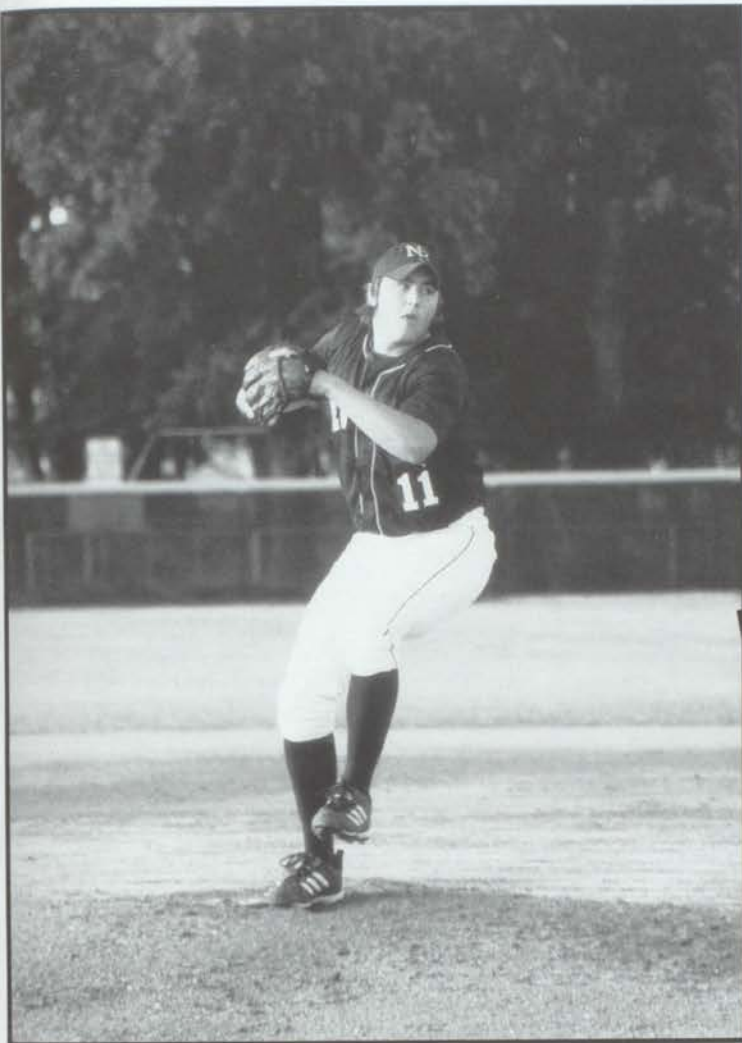

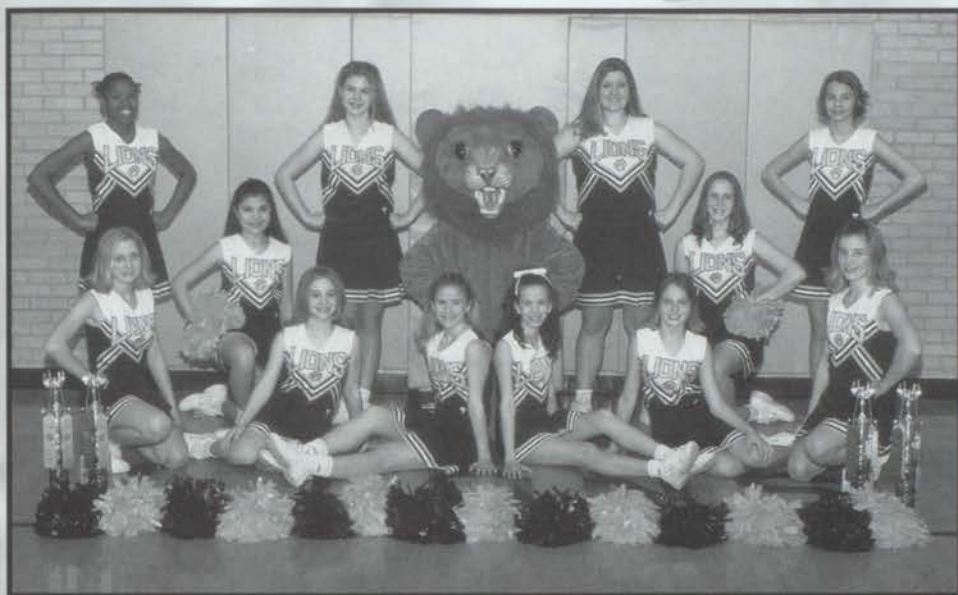

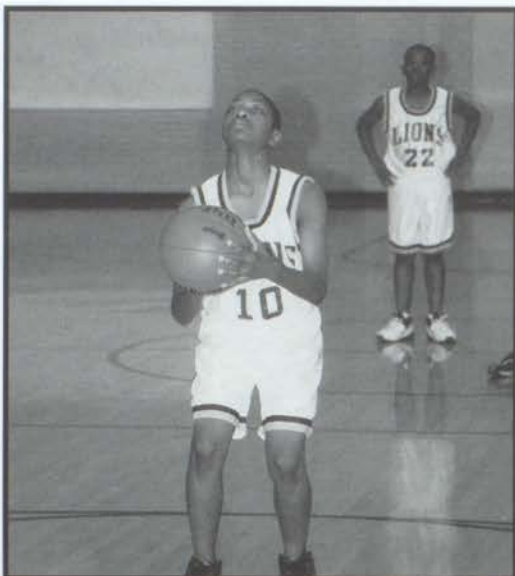

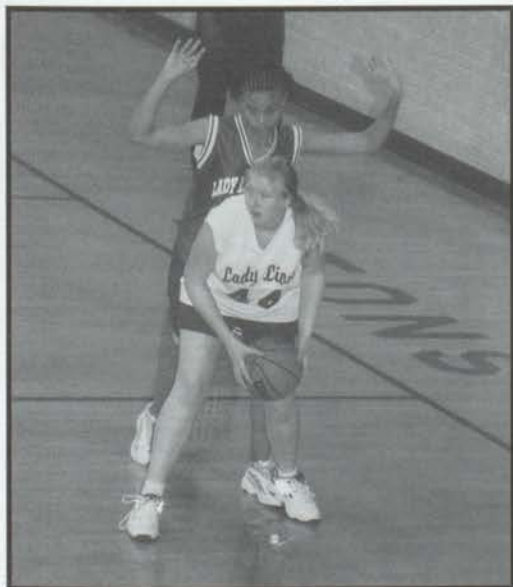

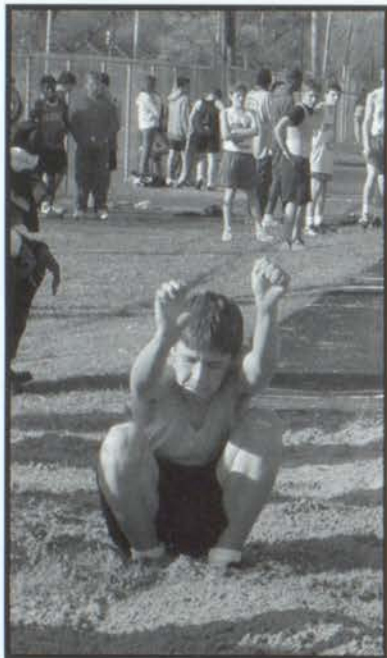

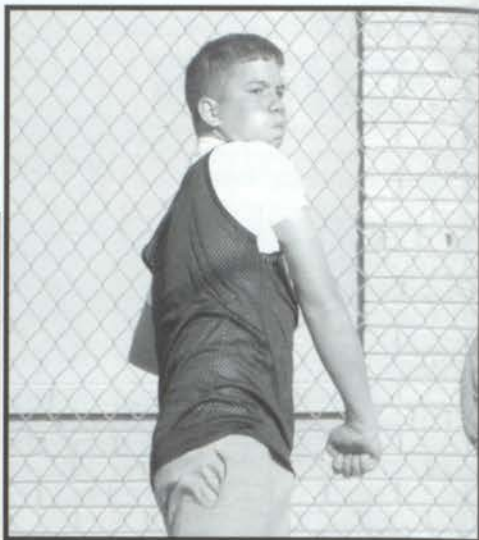

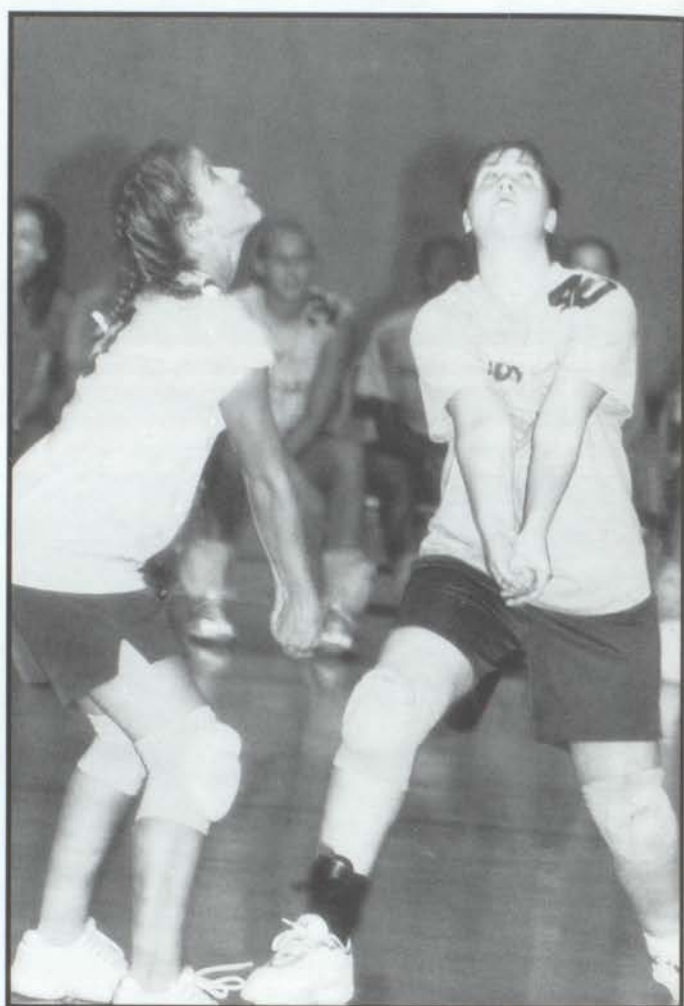

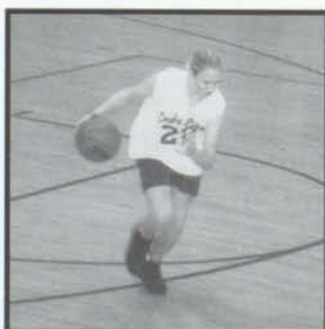

The book was printed by Jostens Publishing Company at the Topeka Plant with a pressrun of 400 copies. The publisher's representative was Rikki Bolding and in-plant consultant was Melissa Walder. Volume 50 of the book sold to students for \$35. Extra copies will be sold for \$40 on first come first serve basis.

All 248 pages of the *Lion's Den* were prepared on four IBM computers using Pagemaker 6.5 software. This is the first time this staff has placed digital images directly onto the pages. This year's theme *A Lion through Time* was selected by the staff because it represents each of us that have walked down the halls of this school. The cover is a traditional maroon with gold foil overlay.

The yearbook is divided into six sections, each having an individual theme spin-off. **People** - *There's a Lion in the Crowd*, **Academics** - *Lions lead the Way*, **Clubs** - *Lions in Motion*, **Sports** - *Untameable Lions*, **Middle School** - *Lion cubs on the Prowl*, **Advertisements** - *Where's the Lion in You?*

Most photographs were taken by the Lion's Den adviser or staff members with the exception of senior portraits, undersclass individual portraits, high school favorites and group athletic and band pictures, which were taken by New Boston Photography.

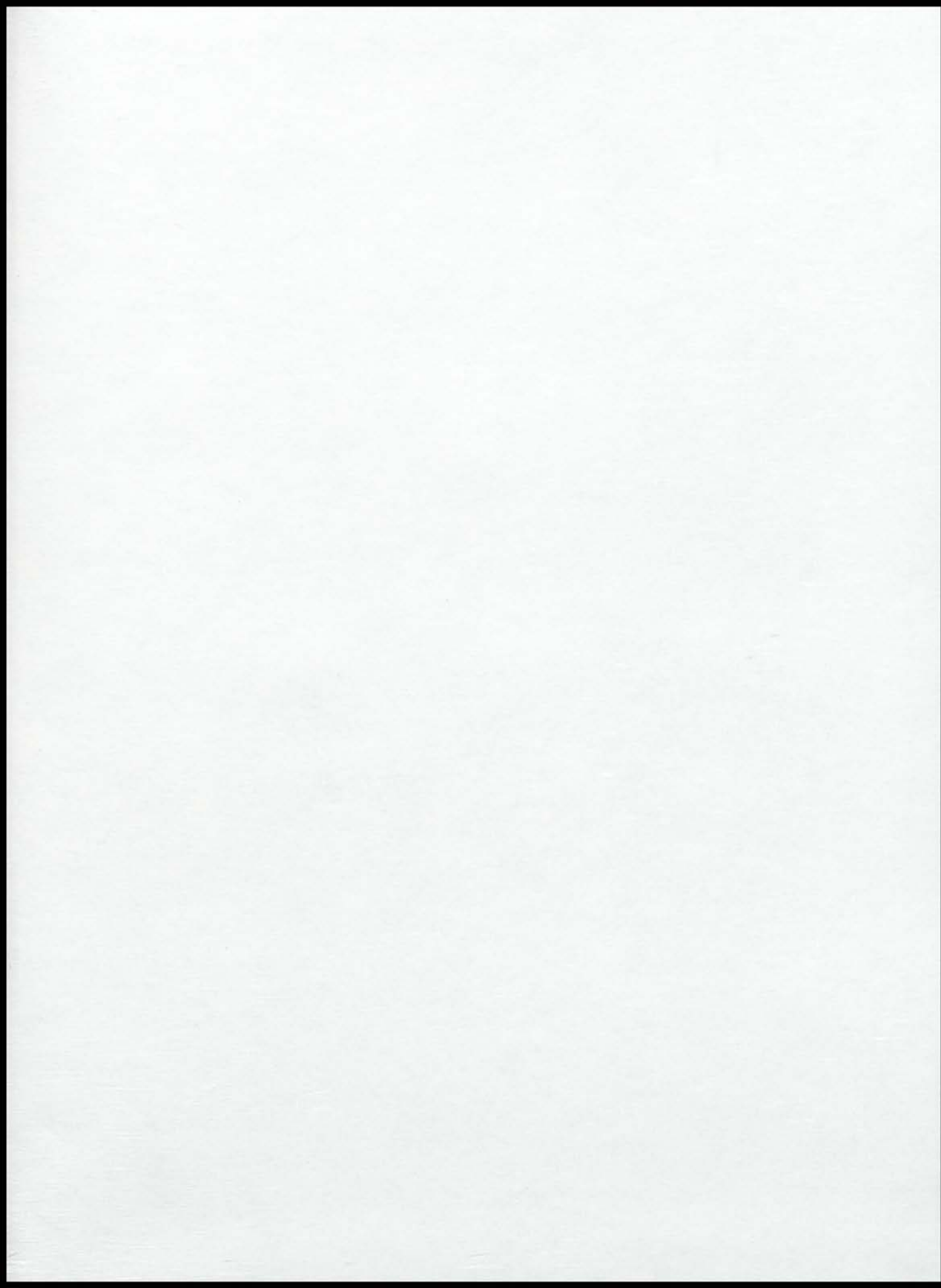

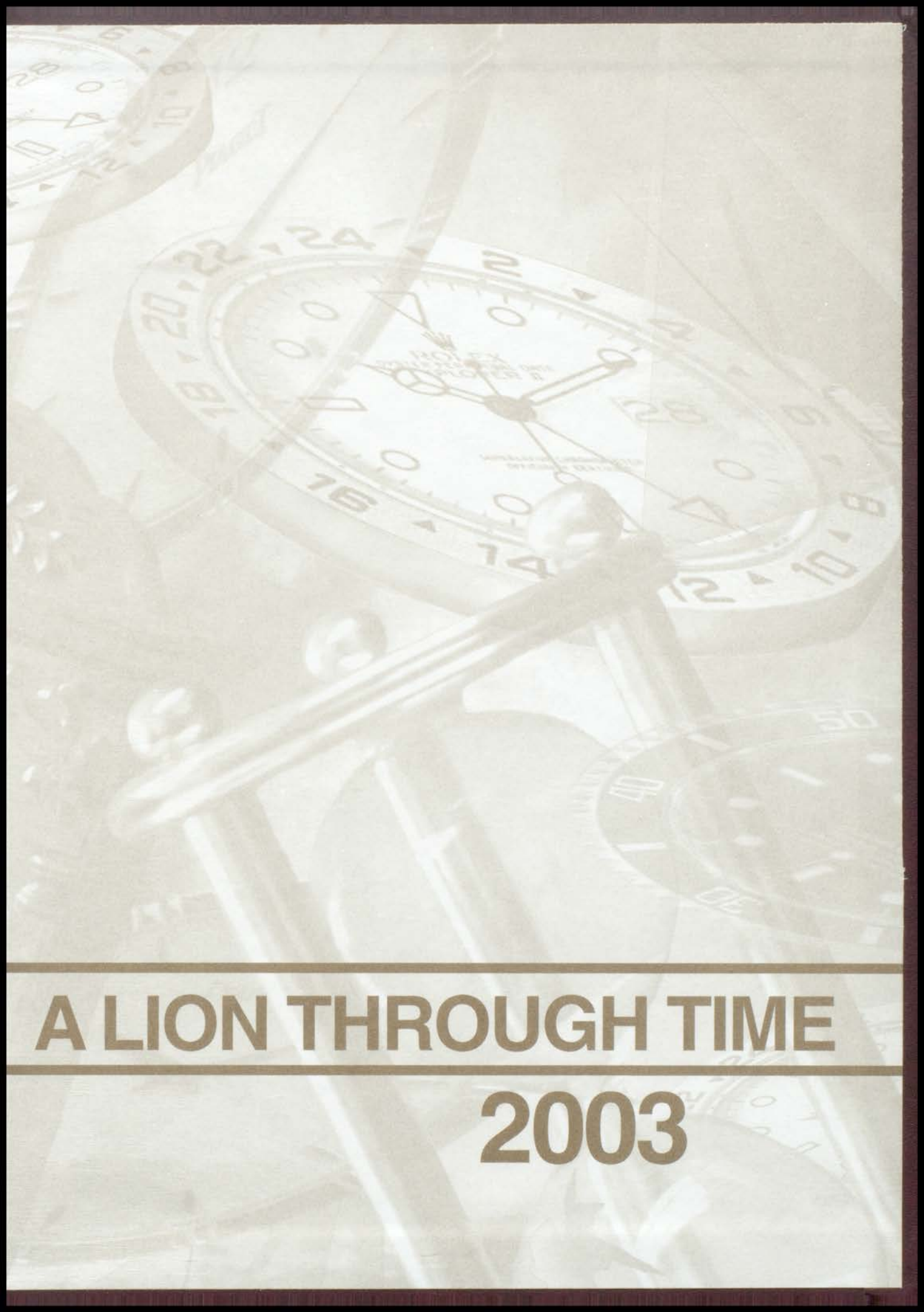
