Meeting Minutes

The Board of Education of Unified School District No. 265, Sedgwick County, Goddard, Kansas, met at 7:00 p.m., on Monday, September 12th, 2016, for a regularly scheduled meeting in the Board of Education Room of the USD 265 Central Administration Center. 1. Call to Order

President Ruth Wood called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
