In 650 words or less, reflect on a time when you challenged a belief or idea. What prompted you to act? Would you make the same decision again? (In conclusion, don't forget to tie your topic in with the scholarship for which you are applying.)



In 650 words or less, discuss an accomplishment or event, formal or informal, that marked your transition from childhood into adulthood within your culture, community, or family. (In conclusion, don't forget to tie your topic in with the scholarship for which you are applying.)
