



Chromebook Checkout Agreement

In this agreement, “we,” “us,” and “our” means the District. “You” and “your” means the parent/guardian and student enrolled in A+ Academy Secondary. The “property” is a Chromebook owned by A+ Academy Secondary with the following

Terms:

You will comply at all times with the A+ Academy Secondary’s Student Chromebook Checkout Agreement and Acceptable Use Policy (found at aplussec.apluscharterschools.org), incorporated herein by reference, and made a part hereof for all purposes. Any failure to comply may terminate your rights of possession effective immediately and the District may repossess the property.

Title:

Legal title to the property is in the District and shall at all times remain in the District. Your right of possession and use is limited to and conditioned upon your full and complete compliance with this Agreement and the Acceptable Use Policy.

Loss or Damage:

If the property is damaged, lost, or stolen, you are responsible for the reasonable cost of repair or its fair market value on the date of loss. You must report loss or theft of the property to the District by the next school day after the occurrence.

Seniors must clear all records and pay all fees before participating in graduation ceremonies.

Repossession:

If you do not fully comply with all terms of this Agreement and the Acceptable Use Policy in a timely manner, including the timely return of the property, the District shall be entitled to declare you in default and come to your place of residence, or other location of the property, to take possession of the property.

Terms of Agreement:

Your right to use and possession of the property terminates no later than the last day of the school year unless earlier terminated by the District, upon withdrawal from the District, or in accordance with other arrangements specified by the District.

Appropriation:

Your failure to return the property in a timely manner and the continued use of it for non-school purposes without the District’s consent may be considered unlawful appropriation of the District’s property.
