RE: Comfort Chamber Scholarship

Dear High School Senior,

The 2022 Greater Comfort Area Chamber of Commerce Scholarship program recognizes the achievements of high school seniors in their schools and/or communities. Two \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who will be entering an accredited college, university, community college or trade school this fall.

Who is eligible?

- **Any Spring 2022 graduating Senior. This includes private, public and home school students residing in the Comfort Independent School District.**
- **Seniors planning to further their education** at an accredited institution of higher learning: college, university, or trade school.

What are the requirements?

- Complete and sign the appropriate Comfort Chamber of Commerce Scholarship application.
- Provide two letters of recommendation from people other than a family member.
- Send official high school transcript with ACT and/or SAT scores included.

When is the deadline?

- The scholarship application must be received or postmarked by **Monday, May 2nd, 2022.**

How do I apply?

- Scholarship applications are available online from the Comfort Chamber office (info@comfort-texas.com) and through CISD.
- All completed applications **must be delivered or mailed to:**

What happens if I am selected to receive the scholarship?

- If you are selected, your name will be announced during the High School Awards ceremony.
- **You must make an appointment to meet in person at the Comfort Chamber office. That meeting must take place no later than August 15, 2022.** We will review requirements to complete the award process. Chamber Office Hours: Mon-Fri 10am-3pm.
- **Official proof of enrollment and an official class schedule with the seal of the college will be required at that meeting,** along with the address of the school in which you are enrolled. The scholarship funds will be sent directly to the school.
- You must be enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study for the Fall term of the 2022-23 school year at an accredited institution of higher learning: university, community college, trade or technical school, per the scholarship you received.
- The funds must be used for the academic year 2022-2023, and must be used to cover costs of tuition, fees, or books. No funds will be available to you beyond this academic year.
- If you fail to do any of the above, within the stated timeline, you will forfeit your scholarship, and an alternate recipient will be selected.
