# Happy Halloween! Cider Mill 2020



Halloween is around the corner and will look a little different this year but we are excited to make it a fun day for all! Due to outdoor crowd limitations and overall safety precautions we cannot have a parade this year, however we are inviting students to attend school (in-person and virtually) in their Halloween costumes on Friday, October 30th. If your child would like to wear his or her costume, please ensure to follow these guidelines:

• The costume should be comfortable and your child should be able to wear the costume for the duration of the day. If your child's at-home Halloween costume is more "involved" (example: blow-up T-rex, or box robot), your child should wear a different dress-up costume to school.

- Your child should come to school wearing his or her costume bathrooms cannot be used for changing costumes at all. We don't want any students disappointed that they can't wear costumes.
- As always, please choose costumes without weapons or fake blood/gore. Please also ensure the costume isn't too scary.
- There will be **no** candy distributed by any one. Due to safety guidelines we ask families to please send your child (and your child only) in with a special snack.
- All students must still wear a CDC approved face mask a costume mask does <u>NOT</u> meet CDC guidelines.

Classroom teachers have a variety of activities and crafts planned for students during the day! We will even have a virtual parade to share with all of our families! Thank you for your help in making Halloween 2020 a success!

**Peanut-Free Foods & the Cider Mill Cafeteria:** There are different protocols for nut allergies in the classroom and cafeteria in consultation with our nursing staff. Cider Mill classrooms remain nut free as there are nut allergies on every team. This allows for movement between classrooms as needed for different subjects or activities. Now that we are back in the cafeteria, and students are sitting at individual desks (not tables), Students may bring lunches that contain nuts. Students that require nut free areas for health and safety purposes will sit at desks marked "nut free" for their enhanced safety.

**COVID Procedure & Travel Update:** We anticipate the District to provide an extensive update to COVID-related procedures within the next week. In the meantime, in order to return on site from a state on the travel advisory, you must take the RT-PCR COVID-19 test, and the person had it either in the 72 hours prior to returning or after returning to CT, the person may return back once the negative result comes in AND once the person shares it with the State DPH. Here's the overview: To take advantage of the testing alternative, the traveler must meet the following conditions:

- 1. Must have had a test for COVID-19 in the 72 hours prior to arrival in Connecticut or at any time following arrival in Connecticut;
- 2. The result of such COVID-19 test is negative, and
- 3. Must provide written proof of such negative test results to the Commissioner via email to DPH.COVID-Travel@ct.gov or via facsimile to (860) 326-0529

#### **Arrival/Dismissal Updates**



A sincere thank you for your patience as we continue to improve our dismissal procedures without having an impact on instructional time. Having five roads merge to one road has been a significant challenge for us during our arrival and dismissal. We are very grateful to the Wilton Police Department for their help managing the traffic flow. There is also a new procedure that teachers will be following to help with traffic flow, inclement weather, and social distancing - students who are pickups will now be waiting in their classrooms until they are notified their parents are in the pickup line. It is incredibly important for families to have the names of the children they are picking up clearly visible on the top right side of the windshield for this procedure to work efficiently. We practiced this with two fifth grade classes on Friday, and it worked well. See the sample to the right.


Below are traffic pattern maps created by the Wilton Police Department to help alleviate traffic congestion on Route 7. Please review these maps so you know what the traffic flow will look like for the foreseeable future. All cars will now enter Cider Mill from the Route 7 side of School Road and take a right into Cider Mill. Cars that come from Middlebrook/ Commstock will not be able to take a left into Cider Mill and will be redirected toward the new traffic pattern on Kristine Lilly Way. Please plan accordingly! Car traffic will utilize the tennis court parking lot and Kristine Lilly Way to keep traffic off Route 7. Busses will now be routed directly from the Bus Barn into Cider Mill - they will be the only vehicles taking a left hand turn into Cider Mill from Middlebrook/Comstock. Please also review and adhere to your allotted time of drop off and pickup. Coming to school too early has been holding up the traffic. We also request that you pull up all the way to the car in front of you when picking up your child. See maps and UPDATED times below:
