Spring Events & School Wide Celebrations:

• Kindness Rocks: The Kindness Rock Project is a project, started by Megan Murphy from Cape Cod, MA, where people paint pebbles or cobbles and leave them for others to find and collect. Notes, symbols and messages that promote kindness are added to the rocks. Photos of the painted rocks and hints of where to find them are sometimes shared on social media like Facebook and Twitter. The project started in the U.S. and has spread to the U.K., Australia, and New Zealand as well as other countries.

Wilton Reads Author Visits & Racial Equity and Inclusion Work at Cider Mill School:

- On April 29, 2021, our PTA sponsored author, <u>Andrea Davis Pinkney</u> visited with all of our students at Cider Mill. The presentations were inspiring and thought-provoking for our students.
- On Wednesday, 5/5/21 (@ 12pm), Cider Mill administrators will meet with our students for a
 whole-school read aloud of "Let's Talk About Race" (by Julius Lester) and an activity on exploring the
 concept of identity Zoom Link.
- Throughout the year, our staff have been engaged in excellent professional learning experiences
 with presenters from CREC on the topic of Racial Equity and Inclusion. One key idea embedded
 within Wilton Public School's Portrait of the Graduate is that our learners will embrace diversity. One
 way to accomplish this value is to provide opportunities for students to see themselves and explore
 others' identities within the texts they read and explore.

Dr. Rudine Sims Bishop shares: Books are sometimes windows, offering views of worlds that may be real or imagined, familiar or strange. These windows are also sliding glass doors, and readers have only to walk through in imagination to become part of whatever world has been created and recreated by the author. When lighting conditions are just right, however, a window can also be a mirror. Literature transforms human experience and reflects it back to us, and in that reflection we can see our own lives and experiences as part of the larger human experience. Reading, then, becomes a means of self-affirmation, and readers often seek their mirrors in books. (1990, p. ix). If you're not familiar with Dr.

We will culminate this learning with a late May staff meeting where teachers explore a plethora of books that celebrate diversity through children's literature. With the support of both PTA and District funding, we are very excited that each classroom will receive a set of 15 "window & mirror" texts to add to their classroom libraries. Toward the end of May, staff will engage with these texts and a protocol called the *Courageous Conversations Compass*.

Zero Waste - The picture above shows a 3D representation (created by Sara Quantock) of the number
of cups used by one person who drinks a take away coffee or tea every day for a year. This model
contains 365 used cups that all end up in landfill. Covid has prevented consumers from taking their
reusable cups into coffee shops to be refilled which is understandable. BUT, the real problem is that
these single use items exist. And this is just the tip of the iceberg single use items are EVERYWHERE.
