Weston High School is very proud to be recognized as one of the best high schools in the nation. Newsweek ranked WHS as one of the 1000 best high schools in the country placing the school as #1 in Fairfield County and #2 in Connecticut. US News and World Report also awarded WHS a gold medal as an exemplary high school. Finally, this fall the school was honored to be notified by The Connecticut State Department of Education that it was nominated by the State Commissioner of Education as a 2013 National Blue Ribbon School.

The core belief of the school centers around this commitment: to provide a safe and intellectually challenging environment that will empower students to become innovative thinkers, creative problem-solvers, and inspired learners prepared to thrive in the twenty-first century. Every member of the school community works to uphold this core value using it to make decisions on a daily basis.

Weston High School students continue to demonstrate a strong academic performance. Sophomores were among the top performers on the 2012 Connecticut Academic Performance Test (CAPT). Advanced Placement scores were equally impressive with 94% of the 468 exams scored at a 3 or better. (Score ranges are from 1-5 with a score of 3 regarded as meeting requirements.) Of special note is that the Class of 2012 graduated 4 National AP Scholars. The Class of 2013 is comprised of eleven commended scholars and five semi-finalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program.

The projected enrollment for WHS is 773 students, which represents an increase of one student. Specific projected enrollment differences by grade are as follows: ninth grade a decrease of eleven, tenth grade an increase of forty two, eleventh grade a decrease of sixteen and twelfth grade a decrease of fourteen students.

The high school budget reflects no increase in staffing. The current staffing levels are critical to maintain the exemplary academic and co-curricular program. WHS offers a comprehensive program of studies, which includes 15 Advanced Placement (AP) courses representing a variety of disciplines as well as required and elective offerings that provide our students with opportunities to develop and hone critical skills needed to be successful in life after high school.

There are minimal changes in this budget. Next year AP Macroeconomics will be reintroduced and The Entrepreneurship Seminar, piloted last year, has been included. However, this will be offered by reconfiguring existing staff assignments and section numbers of course offerings. The funding for the accreditation process of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) is no longer necessary. Of special note is the request for new furniture for our new Learning Commons, known formerly as the library. The vision is to create a space that aligns our core beliefs and learning expectations. This space will encourage flexible grouping for enhanced collaboration as well as quiet areas of study and comfortable seating.


