Full credit will be based on the on-time completion of <u>all</u> problems assigned, work to be done in pencil, a proper heading and proper corrections made in pen. Late homework will be accepted with half credit (No later than the next class session).

Attendance Policy:

- 1) Tardies will be marked if a student is not in the classroom by the bell.
- 2) All absences must be excused. If properly excused within 3 days,...
 - students will have the number of days absent to make up any assignments.
 - students must make up any missed quizzes or tests on the first day back. Exceptions may be made for extended, excused absences.
 - Summer school absence policy only allows for 3 total absences. Students will be *dropped* from summer school on the 4th absence.
- 3) If a student knows of an upcoming absence, please discuss with me before the absence, not after.
