TIER 1 STRATEGIES

The countdown to Christmas break has begun. You can use various strategies to incorporate movement and talking to help "control" the excitement. Give students a chance to move and talk productively. There are simple strategies, such as Stand Up, Hand Up, Pair Up; 4 Corners; or just take a break with Team Charades or Reverse.

Here's an interesting <u>article from Brooke's Inclusion Lab</u> on how to help all students improve their oral language skills. It has great tips that kids of all ages need to know - eye contact when talking with someone, complete sentences when responding, sentence syntax, articulating clearly - these are just a few of the topics addressed.

Stand Up, Hand Up, Pair Up

A simple strategy when students have an answer, a response, or their own thoughts, they can stand up, put their hand up (facing out to high five a classmate), and pair up with a partner (by high fiving that partner). Each student will share his/her thoughts and information. Repeat as often as you need. Consider your numbers and if you need groups of 3.

4 Corners

This strategy can be used for students to vote from 4 categories, subjects, or questions. Each student commits to an answer, and the teacher directs the students to that corresponding corner. Once students are in their corners, they should pair or trio up in order to discuss their thoughts and ideas. The teacher can ask for each corner to share out. Don't forget to ask what other students said if your students' listening ears aren't on.

Team Charades

A brain break where 3-4 students stand at the front of the room, but they turn around toward the board. The entire rest of the class gets to view the charade card, and they are the ones who act it out as the 3-4 students guess. Video link




Spice up your Google Slides presentation


Go to presentation mode. Click on the triple dots on the slide remote. Discover: a pointer, a pen and eraser, and your own voiced closed captions options to use as you present.
