ACCSEF Awarded the Community Service Tax Credit

The Atchison County Community Schools Education Foundation (ACCSEF) was awarded \$197,500 worth of tax credits to be distributed to donors supporting the "Multi-Purpose Room" (MPR) Project. All individuals, businesses, companies, LLC's, S-Corps, etc. subject to Kansas State income tax are eligible to receive tax credits from this offering.

<u>Guidelines:</u> ACCSEF is requesting a minimum donation of \$1,000 to the MPR project between now and March 31, 2022. The Tax Credits are not retroactive to donations or pledges previously made. You can pledge a donation to be made in the future, but the tax credit only applies to donations that are transacted before March 31, 2022. Kansas Tax forms are required to be completed with each donation. All payments and transactions will funnel through the ACCSEF. Donors must apply for the tax credit and submit payment before credits can be issued.

Frequently Asked Questions:

How do tax credits work? If you donate \$1,000 to the MRP project, you will receive a tax credit voucher for \$700. If your 2021 or 2022 (depending on which year you donated in) Kansas Income Tax liability is \$500, you can then apply the \$700 tax credit and receive a refund of \$200 from the State of Kansas. Additional, the remaining \$300 of your \$1,000 donation that did not apply to the tax credit, can be deducted from your Federal Income Tax.

<u>Is labor or material donated to the MPR project eligible for tax credits?</u> At this time the Education Foundation is only distributing the tax credit to cash donations. This is done in an effort to lessen the administrative burden to the Foundation and to encourage new donation activity to help make the MPR a success.

Tax Credit Example:

\$1,000 Donation to the MPR Project = \$700 State Tax Credit (\$300 deductible to Federal Tax)

\$500 Kansas Income Tax Liability

<u>-\$700 Credit</u>

\$200 Refund
