Guidelines for Dickinson County Farm Bureau Association Scholarships

Dickinson County Farm Bureau Association will award scholarships this year, amounts to be determined at a later date. Scholarship application deadline is April 15th.

1. Applicant must be a high school senior.
2. Applicant must have a cumulative high school grade point average of 2.8 or better.
3. Applicant may enter any approved post high school study course. This is to include all colleges or universities, junior colleges, vocational technical schools or business schools, as long as the program is of at least one year's duration.
4. Applicant or their parent must be a member in good standing of the Dickinson County Farm Bureau Association.
5. Application must be completed and received by the County Farm Bureau by April 13th. They may be emailed or mailed to the ABOVE address. **Do NOT drop off applications at the insurance office in Abilene. This scholarship is offered by the farmers and ranchers in Dk. County—NOT Farm Bureau Insurance CO. Applications left at the insurance office will be disqualified.**
6. The scholarship award will be issued following the satisfactory completion of one semester & enrollment for the following semester. Please provide a copy of your college grades and proof of next semester's enrollment to the county office no later than January 31st. The check will be mailed after receiving these items.

In the awarding of the scholarships, preference will be given as follows:

1. Applicants who will be studying agriculture.
2. Applicants that demonstrate financial need.
3. Applicants whose parents are voting members and have actively participated in Farm Bureau activities.

The Board of Directors will review all applications, keeping in mind the above priorities, and will select students for the scholarships. They will be notified in writing. The applicants that were not selected will also be notified in writing of the decision.
