1. Science Assessment Scores: We recently received our scores for the science assessment that our Juniors took last year. We scored well above the state average. Our median score was a 296 and the states median score was a 289. We continue to do really well on our state assessments.
2. School Improvement:
Goals: The High School has picked the following two goals to work on for school improvement.
 - a. Career Awareness and Guidance: Documents career awareness and guidance system including an established plan curriculum focused on careers, and promoting the value of a variety of post-graduation opportunities, and Individual Plan of Study for each student.
 - b. Planning for Safe learning Environment: Adopts and implements Kansas Social, Emotional, and Character Development Model Standards. Shows evidence of Kansas Social, Emotional, and Character Development Model Standards in long range planning goals. Collects and evaluates data on impact across district.
3. Plan for each of these goals:
 - a. Mrs. Ladewig has been in the classrooms working with students on the Career Cruising platform. Soon she will sit down with each student and develop an individual plan of study.
 - b. Mrs. Waymire has begun meeting with seminars to go over the Kansas Social, Emotional, and Character Development standards. She will meet with each seminar once a month to cover these standards.
4. We have students enrolled in 38 ACC Career and Tech Education courses.
The Certification Programs through ACC that we have students enrolled in are:
 - a. Criminal Justice
 - b. Pharmacy Tech
 - c. Medical Office Assistant
 - d. Information Technology (IT)
 - e. Early Childhood Education
 - f. Business Management
 - g. Addictions and Prevention Studies
5. We have nine students enrolled in Technical Education Courses through NCCC. 7 of these are in the welding program and 2 are in the HVAC program. This is up from just two last year. We also have several students enrolled in the CNA program at NCCC.
6. We have 18 kids that are enrolled in 6 hours at NCCC this semester. We have another 7 kids that are enrolled in 12 hours.
