# Teach More, Test Less: Testing Transparency Report

Presented by:

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- Based on the concerns conveyed to the Commissioner surrounding the use of assessments, and in accordance with Section 1 of Subpart F of Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2014, the Commissioner directed the Office of Teacher and Leader Effectiveness to review each district's APPR plan to identify opportunities for local action to ensure the minimum assessments necessary are used to inform effective decision making.
- NYSED encourages districts to use the Testing
   Transparency Report to help review their currently
   approved APPR plan to identify modifications that would
   be approvable by the Department and result in less testing
   for students.

## Who...What...Why

#### 1: Use of Pre-Assessments

- Reduce the number of preassessments:
  - using past performance trends, historical data, and/or
  - prior-year assessment results to inform the baseline used to set targets within SLOs.
  - Current APPR: K-2, 3<sup>rd</sup>,
     Other Teachers, NYSAA,
     and NYSESLAT)

### 2: Use of (1) Assessment for Multiple Uses

- Remove the locally-adopted assessment and use the same State assessment in both subcomponents, but in different ways (e.g., growth versus achievement; student sub-groups, such as lowest or highest performing students).
- Current APPR: NYSAA and NYSESLAT.
- Remove the locally-adopted assessment and replace with existing State assessments and/or use a school-wide growth/achievement measure.

#### 3: Use of School-wide, Group, or Team Measures

- Use the current locallyadopted assessment and replace with school-wide growth/ achievement based on locally-adopted assessment results.
- Current APPR: Other Teachers, ESL, Reading, Math, Enrichment, Resource, and ESL
