

REFUSAL OF ENTRY

HUDSON ISD POLICY

Hudson ISD expects all persons to act appropriately on school property and at all school functions. Parents have a right to be involved in their child's education, but this may be revoked due to inappropriate behavior.

Involvement in extracurricular activities is not a right of parents, but a privilege and may therefore be revoked based on off campus behavior including, but not limited to harassment of staff, inappropriate comments on social media, and similarly inappropriate conduct toward the district.

In accordance with Texas Education Code 37.105, the District has the right to refuse entry or eject a person from property under the District's control.

The following policy may be found under HISD Policy GKA (Legal/Local):

A school administrator, school resource officer, or school district peace officer may refuse to allow persons to enter on or may eject a person from property under the district's control if the person refuses to leave peaceably on request and:

1. The person poses a substantial risk of harm to any person; or
2. The person behaves in a manner that is inappropriate for a school setting and:
 - a. The administrator, resource officer, or peace officer issues a verbal warning to the person that the person's behavior is inappropriate and may result in the person's refusal of entry or ejection; and
 - b. The person persists in that behavior.
3. District personnel may request assistance from law enforcement in an emergency or when a person is engaging in behavior rising to the level of criminal conduct.

A person ejected from or refused entry to District property under this provision may appeal this action by filing an appeal under FNG(LOCAL) or GF(LOCAL).
