Community - Little Cypress-Mauriceville C.I.S.D. is one of the premier public school districts in Southeast Texas.

LCMCISD encompasses 102 square miles of northern Orange, Texas. Approximately 3,357 students are enrolled in the district's one high school, two junior high schools, one intermediate school and two elementary schools.

School - Little Cypress-Mauriceville High School is a comprehensive four year public high school enrolling nearly 1100 students in grades 9-12. The school is accredited by the Texas Education Agency and holds membership in the College Board and the National Association of College Admission Counselors, is a STEM Academy, and is a Microsoft™ Innovative School. Fifty-nine percent of our graduates will attend four year colleges, while twenty-seven percent will attend a two year college or trade school and fourteen percent will enter the military or workforce.

Curriculum - The academic program is organized on a daily 8 period schedule. Four credits per semester is the maximum course load; students take eight, 47-minute classes per day. There are several Career and Technology Education courses that are multi-blocked, and students enrolled in those courses will attend more than 47 minutes per day.

The following AP® courses are offered: English Language, English Literature, Statistics, Calculus, Government, and Music Theory. AP is an open-enrollment program.

Honors classes and/or Pre-Advanced Placement courses are offered in English 1, English 2, Geometry, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, College Algebra, College Pre-Calculus, Biology 1, Biology 2, Anatomy, Chemistry 1, Chemistry 2, World History, US History 1, US History 2, Economics, Spanish 1, Spanish 2, Spanish 3, and Spanish 4, Principles of Engineering, Aerospace Engineering, and Engineering 4.

Dual-credit courses with Lamar State College-Orange are offered for juniors and seniors in: Anatomy, Health Science, EMT, and Process Technology 1 & 2. Students are required to meet LSC-O testing requirements to enroll. Dual-Credit courses with the University of Texas Tyler are offered for juniors and seniors in Calculus, Pre-Calculus, College Algebra, US History, Political Science, English, Chemistry, Biology, Mass Communications, and Music Appreciation. Students are required to meet UT Tyler testing requirements to enroll.

Grading and Ranking

LCM CISD policy established a 6.0 weighted scale for the purposes of rank. Beginning with grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Exceptions are summer school and correspondence grades. A minimum of 26 credits is **required for graduation**. Advanced Placement, Pre-Advanced Placement, Honors, and Dual-Credit classes are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed at the end of the spring semester of the 9th, 10th, and 11th grade years, at the end of the first semester of the senior year, and a final rank at the end of the fifth six weeks of the senior year.
