Fifteen to twenty minutes of reading each day will work miracles! Reading material should be selected by the child but don't forget about magazines, comics, and newspapers. They allow for varied presentation of materials and open doors for discussion. The best way to help your child better understand what they are reading is to discuss things. Children need to have conversations with adults to allow mature reasoning to develop. Talking to your child and having them explain WHY or HOW is very beneficial in developing comprehension strategies that will carry over to school.
