Definition of Title I:

- Title I provides federal funding to our campus to help students who are not achieving their potential or are most at risk of falling behind.

Definition of Title I:

- Title I money is given to campuses based on the percentage of students receiving free or reduced lunch.
- Schools with at least 40% percent of their students on free or reduced lunch are eligible for a school-wide program.




Kopperl ISD operates
a Title I School-wide Program.

School-wide means:

- **The campus uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the campus.**
- **Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement.**
- **Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting the State's performance targets.**

To be a “School-wide” School:

- **The campus must have a free/reduced lunch count of at least 40%.**
- **The campus must collect and analyze data that effects student achievement.**
- **The campus must develop a comprehensive site plan and annually review the effectiveness of the plan.**

Summary:

At KISD we feel that parent involvement is a very important part of the school and the education of students.
