

**County Line School District
Annual Report to the Public
October 28, 2013**

On October 28, 2013 the County Line School District held its Annual Report to the Public. The meeting was held in the auditorium classroom at 7:00 p.m.

Issues of public interest discussed at the meeting included accreditation status, enrollment, federal programs, the gifted and talented program, norm referenced testing results, criterion referenced testing results, finances, facilities and other areas of public interest. School reports were presented by Elementary Principal Joan Jones and High School Principal Taylor Gattis. A district report was presented by Superintendent Joan Jones.

All schools in the district are accredited by the Arkansas Board of Education. District enrollment as of October 1 is 442.

All members of the Board of Education are in compliance with code regarding annual training hours.

The district as a matter of policy complies with all federal, state, and local codes. Policies, procedures and plans are on file in the superintendent's office and are available for public viewing upon request.

This district is a School Choice participant.

The district, including the elementary and high school, have developed an improvement plan (ACSIP) in compliance with state and federal code. The district will continue to monitor and amend this plan to ensure that students are provided with opportunities to attain an excellent education.

The district's finances continue to be sound and as projected. County Line ended the 2012-2013 school year with a closing legal balance of \$1,052,112.95 and the projected closing legal balance for 2013-2014 is \$1,039,156.56.

The district has a facility master plan that is reviewed and updated annually. The school district also completed the construction of the safe room. This facility will hold the entire student body and staff in the event of a tornado. It is also available to the community, after school hours, during a tornado warning. The safe room is used as a P.E. facility during the regular school day. The project was funded through FEMA, state partnership, QSCB, and the local district.
