SPECIFIC HEALTH CONDITIONS

PLEASE CALL, EMAIL, OR COME BY THE OFFICE IF your child has a health condition or special needs that need to be discussed in detail. Even with alerts in place, discussing issues at length helps us provide better care for your child. Please keep all contact information up-to-date. Be sure that all emergency contacts and phone numbers are accurate. Required supplies may be brought to the clinic by parent/guardian to be accessed as needed.

MEDICATIONS

PRESCRIBED MEDICATIONS that need to be given during school hours <u>MUST</u> be brought to the school by parent/guardian, and have an up-to-date *Dayton ISD Medication Order Form* completed on file with prescribing information matching the prescription on the (original) container. *Dayton ISD Medication Order Form* <u>MUST</u> be signed by both parent/guardian and prescribing provider. PRESCRIBED Medications <u>will NOT be given</u> without completed form on file. PRESCRIBED Medications are stored in locked cabinets in the clinic.

*OTC MEDICATIONS can be brought to the school by parent/guardian for your child to take as needed. OTC medications must be age-appropriate, unexpired, in original container, with completed *Dayton ISD Medication Permission Form*. OTC Medications are given during the hours of 10:30 am until 1:30 pm to eliminate interacting with medications taken before or after school. OTC medications are stored in locked cabinets in the clinic.



WHEN SHOULD YOU KEEP YOUR CHILD HOME?

If your child has a temperature of 100.0 or higher, diarrhea, vomiting, or any other sign or symptom of a contagious illness, please keep your child at home. Your child should stay home from school for at least a full 24 hours after any of these symptoms have subsided.

VACCINATIONS

State law requires students in Texas schools to be immunized against certain vaccine-preventable diseases. Please refer to the Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements for Students in Grades K-12 on the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Immunization Unit website at https://www.dshs.texas.gov/immunize/school/. **Proof of Tdap and Meningococcal Vaccines is required and must be provided prior to entry into 7th grade.** If you are unsure of where your child can receive vaccines, contact your healthcare provider or local health department. Without the proper documentation of required vaccinations or a valid medical or conscientious exemption, students will not be allowed to attend school.
