What is Veterans' Day?

1. Veterans' Day is always observed on November 11.
2. On Veterans' Day, Americans honor all living military veterans, including the many working moms who are veterans of military service.
3. Veterans' Day is celebrated with speeches and parades across the U.S.
4. The holiday began as Armistice Day on November 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I.
5. In 1926, Congress passed a resolution for an annual observance.
6. In 1938, Nov. 11 became a national holiday.
7. In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed legislation changing the name to Veterans' Day in order to honor veterans of all American wars.
