Robotics Team Competes, Qualifies for State

On Saturday January 10, 2015 the Indiahoma “Indy Roboters” took a little trip to Lawton to compete in the VEX Open Robotics tournament held at MacArthur Middle School. One High School VEX team, Two Jr. High VEX teams, and two elementary school VEX IQ teams competed in an all day long event with approximately 50 other teams from all over Oklahoma. The teams consisted of Kaylyn White HS team 9246 C, Chloe Nevarez 8th grade team 9246 B, Laurellai Shreffler and Adrianna Sallee 7th grade team 9246 A, Blake Baldwin and Michael York 3rd grade Elementary team 101555 X, and Diego Ramirez and Craig Chibitty 3rd grade elementary team 101555 W.

This year the VEX teams, Jr. High and High school, played the “Game” Skyrise. They had to work together with another team to build a tower and place large cubes over the tower. They also had to place the cubes over pipes ranging from 24 inches to 46 inches high. Additionally, the teams could place cubes into special scoring squares on the game field. The game play lasted 90 seconds and was very fast for the observer and extremely long for the players. After storming through more than 40 games the teams took a rest while the officials sorted out who would go on to the final rounds of play. Our teams did not make the finals but did well. Team 9246 A, 7th graders Laurellai Shreffler and Adrianna Sallee, placed the highest of our teams at 14th. Team 9246 B, 8th grader Chloe Navarez, placed 31st and Team 9246 C, 10th grader Kaylyn White, placed 44th. The teams will have the chance to play one more time at the State Technology Students Association competition in April.

The elementary teams, 10184X and 10184 W, played the “Game Highrise” where they had to move three inch colored cubes from a holding area to an area where they could score two different ways. To score in the first area the team moved cubes from a holding area to a flagged part of the game field. In the second scoring area, within the flagged area, the team had to stack colored cubes onto stacks of a like color. The game round lasted 60 seconds and was very nerve racking, especially for the parents and grandparents who were watching. Two teams played at the same time on the field and could not touch the other team’s robot during the game.

Our two 3rd grade teams had a blast playing against all the VEX IQ middle school teams. They were like watching a box of bouncy balls that have been dropped onto the floor, bouncing all over the place. Team 10184X placed 9th in both the Teamwork Rankings and Finalist Rankings. Team 10184W placed 11th in the Teamwork Rankings. Team 10184X went on to play in the finals winning the prestigious Elementary School Excellence Award. This was awarded because the judges “missed the fact” that the team was made up of third graders. The judges wrote “Because it was obvious from the rankings in the teamwork, robot skills etc. – team 10184X should have been awarded the Elementary Excellence Award.”

Because team 10184X won this award they have automatically advanced to the Oklahoma State VEX IQ event that will be held in Tahlaquah Oklahoma April 7th. The Team will be practicing their skills over the next few weeks so that they can “Whoop some Middle School tail”. Congratulations to all the Indy Roboters teams we are very proud to call you our champs.

Indiahoma students will enjoy a three day weekend Monday as the school staff train during a professional day. Enjoy your time with your children.


