Notice to Parents and Guardians:

Pursuant to the federal "No Child Left Behind Act," P.L. 107-110 (Title 1x, Sec. 9528), The Indianapolis Public School must disclose to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning (Colleges and Technical Schools), upon request, the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of high school students.

The district must also notify parents/guardians of their right and the right of their child to request that the district not release such information without prior written consent.

Parents/guardians wishing to exercise their option to withhold their consent to the release of the above information to military recruiters and institutions of higher learning (Colleges or Technical Schools) must submit their request in writing to Mr. Ellis, principal by April 15, 2012.
