- The Mayflwoer anchored off the coast of Massachusetts on Nov. 9, 1620.
- During the first winter, some lived aboard the Mayflower.
- The first Thanksgiving was probably celebrated between Sept.212 and Nov. 9 1621.
- There were 140 people at the feast, 90 Indian braves and 50 Pilgrims.
- The feast lasted three days eating cod, sea bass, ducks, turkeys, swans, geese and deer.
