New Student Driver Policy

In an attempt to maintain a safe school facility, the following items will be effective immediately:

- Only licensed drivers are permitted to park on the Indianhoma Campus.
- A copy of the student's valid driver's license must be on file in the school office.
- A "Permission to Drive" form must be signed and on file in the school office.
- Vo-tech drivers and/or Vo-tech passengers must have a specific permission form on file in the school office.
- Students must park in the designated parking lot.
All vehicles must be parked east of the gravel driveway.
No parking under the trees or west of the gravel driveway.
- Vehicles are not to be accessed or driven off campus during the lunch period.
- Random checks of compliance will be conducted by school officials and/or local authorities.
