

REGULATION DISCIPLINE CODE--STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

Care of School Property: School property is your property. Take care of it. Take pride in keeping halls and grounds clean. Throw waste materials into the containers provided for this purpose. Do not destroy school property. Be a good citizen. Pick up trash or help with general cleanliness of the school area.

Cheating: Any student who is caught cheating or is aiding another student to cheat will be liable for immediate disciplinary action as determined by the teachers and the administrators. The parents will be notified of the action taken. The student will receive an "F" on all material on which he/she cheated and will not be given an opportunity to make up that work. If the teacher and the administrator deem it necessary, the student may lose credit for the class in which the incident occurred.

Classroom Conduct: Any student who becomes such a distraction in class that he/she interferes with the learning process of the other students may be sent to a predetermined disciplinary location or to the office. Any action taken shall be at the discretion of the teacher.

Hall Conduct: Students should adhere to the following guidelines while in the hall.

1. Pass quickly and quietly while staying to the right of the hall.
2. Do not congregate in one area or impede the process of other students.
3. Refrain from loud talking, yelling, etc.
4. Do not run, shove or push.
5. Avoid slamming locker doors.
6. No food or drink in glass containers or squeeze bottles.

Teachers in the hall have the responsibility and authority to enforce these regulations. No student should be in the hall during class time without a hall pass.

Discipline: The responsibility to deal with and correct student misbehavior is shared by parents, teachers, and administrators.

Parents have the responsibility to develop in their children, through teaching, counseling, and role-modeling, good behavior habits, respect for authority and a positive, proper attitude concerning school.

Teachers have the responsibility to provide a classroom environment that is safe, appropriate and orderly, and to establish an atmosphere conducive to learning.

Administrators have the responsibility to establish a climate of high expectations for teacher and students, and to deal effectively with students who chose to interrupt the educational process.

Public Display of Affection (PDA): All students are to refrain from the public display of affection while on campus. Public display of affection includes kissing, leaning against each other, hands in each other's pockets, arms around each other in an affectionate manner, and hands in each other's clothing. The only acceptable form of PDA will be the holding of hands. Students not honoring the PDA code will receive disciplinary action. Rules pertaining to PDA include attendance at ball games and dances.

Drugs, Tobacco and Alcoholic Beverages: The use or possession of tobacco products or the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited at any time during the school day, at any time while on school grounds or any time while on school sponsored events or school activities. All drugs prescribed by a physician shall be left with the school principal or his/her designee..

Weapons: No weapons of any type (knives, guns or martial arts items) or other items that may be used or construed as a weapon shall be in the possession of any student while on school grounds or any time while on school-sponsored events or school activities. Possession of weapons of any type is prohibited from possession of any student on a school bus or other vehicle used by the district for student or teacher transportation. Possession of a firearm shall result in suspension for a period of 12 months. The superintendent may make exceptions to the length of suspension.
