

Arrival & Dismissal

Arrival:

Students should not arrive earlier than 8:30, as it creates a supervision problem. We appreciate you assisting us in keeping all of our students safe. Our doors will remained locked until our first bell at 8:30. Students arriving prior to that time will need to wait with their parents or supervising party. Afternoon only classes should not arrive before 12:30.

Student arriving on the school bus, will be dismissed from the bus at 8:35, with the first bell. They will go directly to class. Students eating breakfast will be dismissed earlier if possible to begin eating breakfast.

Students being dropped off will drop students off at the curb on the West side of the building. Please enter the drop off line from Yorktown entering on the far south entrance. Please have your children ready to depart when you arrive at the area in front of the doors. A quick departure helps the line to move through smoothly. Early Childhood and PreK students will be dropped off in the morning in the east parking lot at 8:35.











Arrival & Dismissal

Dismissal:

All bus students exit the North doors.

Kdg – 5th students who are car riders, will exit through the gym door. Each family is assigned a number. Students will be notified when you arrive via their number in class. Please have your family name/number card clear and visible in your windshield. It is important that you pull up as far as possible to allow us to dismiss the students smoothly and quickly. We appreciate your help with this process.

We do not allow parents to park and walk up to get their child(ren). It creates an unsafe situation and therefore, cannot be allowed. Please watch your speed and attention in the carrider area as there are many children exiting to their cars and/or walking home. We strive to create a safe environment for our student's dismissal.

Early Childhood/PreK students who are car riders, will be escorted and picked up in the east parking lot. Students will be walked out to reunite with their parent/guardian.











Breakfast & Lunch

Breakfast

- Students can eat breakfast at school
- Breakfast begins at 8:30 a.m.
- Menu can be found online



Lunch

- 30 minutes during the day
- Cost TBD
- Students receive a lunch number at the beginning of the year and will use it to get their meal
- Menus are available on the district website. Food service sends our weekly emails with meal balances
- Lunches brought from home are welcome. Please make sure your child can open containers. Kindergartners may not use the microwave



What can you do to make it a good school year?

- Keep schedule changes to a minimum. When a change is necessary, please contact the teacher <u>and</u> the office.

What can you do?

- Help your child be able to write his/her name.
- Your child needs opportunities for play outside of school.
- Reading to your child daily is important...
- Writing exploration at home is critical.
- At elementary level research does not support homework as a rule. At Prairie Creek we do encourage reading logs and practice on math facts/concepts.
- Hands on experiences are another teacher for your child.

Kindergarten students will have the opportunity to spend a day in a kindergarten classroom in August. During this visitation, some initial assessments will be done and then class lists will be created. Our hope is that we will be able to balance classroom needs by providing this visitation time. Online Registration

- Registration opens July 20
- You will receive an email via School Messenger with details
- You will need a birth certificate, two proofs of residency and immunization records.
- Proofs of residency can include a mortgage statement, house contract or lease agreement; and a utility statement.
- Transportation can be selected during the registration process.



Kindergarten fees

- Fees are \$125 (\$100 for registration, plus \$25 for technology), paid at the time of registration. Fees can be paid via RevTrak (link at usd385.org) or via check/cash at the school.
- Transportation fees can be paid online or with check/cash at the District Office.
- Students will need a food service account to purchase meals.
- Applications for free/reduced meals are available at usd385.org >> Departments >> Food Service. (Must be completed annually.)
- Students approved for free/reduced meals also are eligible for free/reduced fees



Kindergarten Orientation

- Orientation Days: Aug. 11, 12 and 13. Your child will attend school one of those days.
- Specific information regarding the date(s) and time(s) your child will attend will be communicated in early August.
- Parents will provide transportation on these days.
- Monday, Aug. 16 First day for all kindergarten students - 8:45 - 3:45
