1. **4:00 ELDP: Update on enrollment/languages of district program and program overview** - Mrs. Hutchinson  
**\*WES ELDP Class up from 5 in 15-16 to 7 16-17**  
**\*District ELL #'s – 259 students across the district, 201 students are “active” and receiving services.**  
**\*31 languages spoken – largest groups Vietnamese, Chinese, Spanish, Arabic**  
**\*We do have a language translation service that allows us to use a translator through 3-way calling.**  
**\*ELDP program exists at each level – elementary, middle, and high school**  
**\*Classroom Integration Plan – 2 year program, each semester has a little more inclusion and a little less para support.**
2. **4:20 Update on Facilities Long-range Master Plan Study** – David Jackson, Executive of Operations, and Mr. Rasmussen, Superintendent of Schools  
**\*Why are we looking at facilities? We want to be up to date and cutting edge. We are steadily growing as a district, and want to plan for the future. All our facilities will be paid off within three years, and it will be time to re-invest in our facilities.**  
**\*Teachers were brought together to create the “ideal school.” Another group compared what we have to the ideal to figure out what was needed. That list was brought to a steering committee to put together options on what should come next.**  
**\*Current Thoughts - High School - Not 3 high schools, growth isn’t rapid enough. ACHS is in good order, AHS was opened in 80’s and is in need of update. AHS - stay at current location. Options – build a new school on the same site, extensive remodel? Decisions will be made in the next couple months. Middle School - 3 MS when we move to 3 HS. AMS needs more work than ACMS – some updates and repairs will happen to bring it up to date. Needs a new roof, needs modifications. Elementary Schools – Looking at adding space to various schools to meet needs, such as more Pre-K space. Looking to upgrade safety where visitors have to be routed through office, looking to give “hardened” shelters to schools without shelters. Meadowlark is oldest operating building in district – options include remodeling Meadowlark on site, or building a new Meadowlark. If Meadowlark rebuilt, space would be repurposed.**  
**\*Athletic Facilities – Proposed that ACHS is upgraded to use for their own stadium, AHS gets upgraded stadium.**  
**\*District Office- Right now comprised of 3 locations. Possibly repurposing Meadowlark to bring all district offices into one, more convenient space.**  
**\*Timeline – Committee meets next week to put together formalized options to send to staff for feedback. Goal is to have a master plan developed to present to school board in November. Looking to get it done in a timely manner – state will pay 26%.**
