
Oklahoma Schools Insurance Group Scholarship Application Form

OSIG Scholarship Guidelines

- To qualify, students must be currently enrolled in an OSIG member school in good standing as of January 1.
- The scholarship will be awarded annually to three graduating high school seniors from each quadrant (as classified by OSIG) in the state of Oklahoma. There will be no discrimination made as to this scholarship based on race, color, religion, national origin or sex, by either OSIG or participating member schools. The quadrants, Northwest, Northeast, Southwest & Southeast are designated by the boundaries of Interstate 40 running East and West and Interstate 35 running North and South. The high school address will be used in determining which quadrant the applicant is located.

- The scholarship will be awarded to the top three finalists from each quadrant. The award amounts will be \$2,000 for the first finalist, \$1,500 for the second, and \$1,000 for the third.
- Each recipient will receive a one-time cash scholarship, to be used by the student to help defray the
 costs of post-secondary education and related expenses. The check will be made payable to the
 scholarship recipient.
- Each school is responsible for distributing to its students information pertaining to the scholarship application, rules and deadlines.
- Each school must screen and evaluate its own applicants based upon criteria set forth on the OSIG Scholarship Application Form and then choose a single finalist to be forwarded to OSIG for consideration.
 Each member school district may submit only one entry for consideration.
- Entries must be postmarked by March 2, 2018 in order to be considered.
- OSIG will appoint a scholarship committee selected by the OSIG Board of Directors of not less than
 three persons but no more than five to determine the scholarship recipients. The decision of the
 scholarship panel will be final.
- If a student from an OSIG board member's school district is a finalist for scholarship, that board member will be excluded from any and all aspects of the judging process.
- The superintendents of the school districts attended by each of the quadrant winners will be notified in writing of the award being made to the student.
- The scholarship will be awarded on or before the graduation date of each quadrant winner. The scholarship monies will be distributed upon proof of acceptance in a post-secondary institution.
- The selection is based on academic excellence, leadership in school activities and/or work experience
 and community service. Each applicant must be a graduating high school senior and must complete the
 OSIG Scholarship Application by application deadline.
- Applicants need to collect three letters of recommendation from responsible adults who have observed their growth and development over a period of time. One should be by a school employee that is familiar with the applicant's school accomplishments.
- Applicants are required to submit to OSIG two (2) copies of the application materials. These materials
 include the completed application, copies of seven semester (grades 9-12) transcripts, letters of
 recommendation and ACT/SAT test scores.
- The panel will select finalists who will be interviewed by the panel. The applicant must pay travel
 expenses to and from the interview. OSIG cannot pay the travel costs.

Questions 1 and 2 are objective (no evaluator discretion), with a set of points assigned to and awarded from the category into which the applicant falls. Questions 3, 4, and 5 are subjective (evaluator has discretion), with a range of possible points within each category. The evaluator should first choose the category most applicable, then award a point value within the range assigned to that category.
