Each year the Oklahoma State Department of Education issues a profile report for Emerson Elementary School as well as the Duncan School District. It is the responsibility of students, parents, and the entire school staff to continue this long tradition of school excellence.

Our school and district has implemented a minimum of ninety minutes for reading instruction for our Kindergarten through fifth grade students, and we will continue with the RTI instructional model. We will also target math with a sixty minute minimum block for math instruction. As reported from our school report profile, our third grade students scored below state average in reading and math. Our fourth grade reading scores are also below state average. Our fourth grade math scores and all fifth grade scores are above state average in math, reading, social studies, and science. Our entire staff will continue working to improve the quality of education at Emerson. Research proves that a positive learning environment supports and improves student learning. As many of you know and support, we have implemented a Positive Behavior Intervention Supports model since March of 2010.

Emerson Elementary will continue its commitment to be the very best. Parents, students, and staff are working together to communicate positive expectations and to develop good study habits for all students. Parental support and innovative research-based teaching are vital to the continued success at our school.

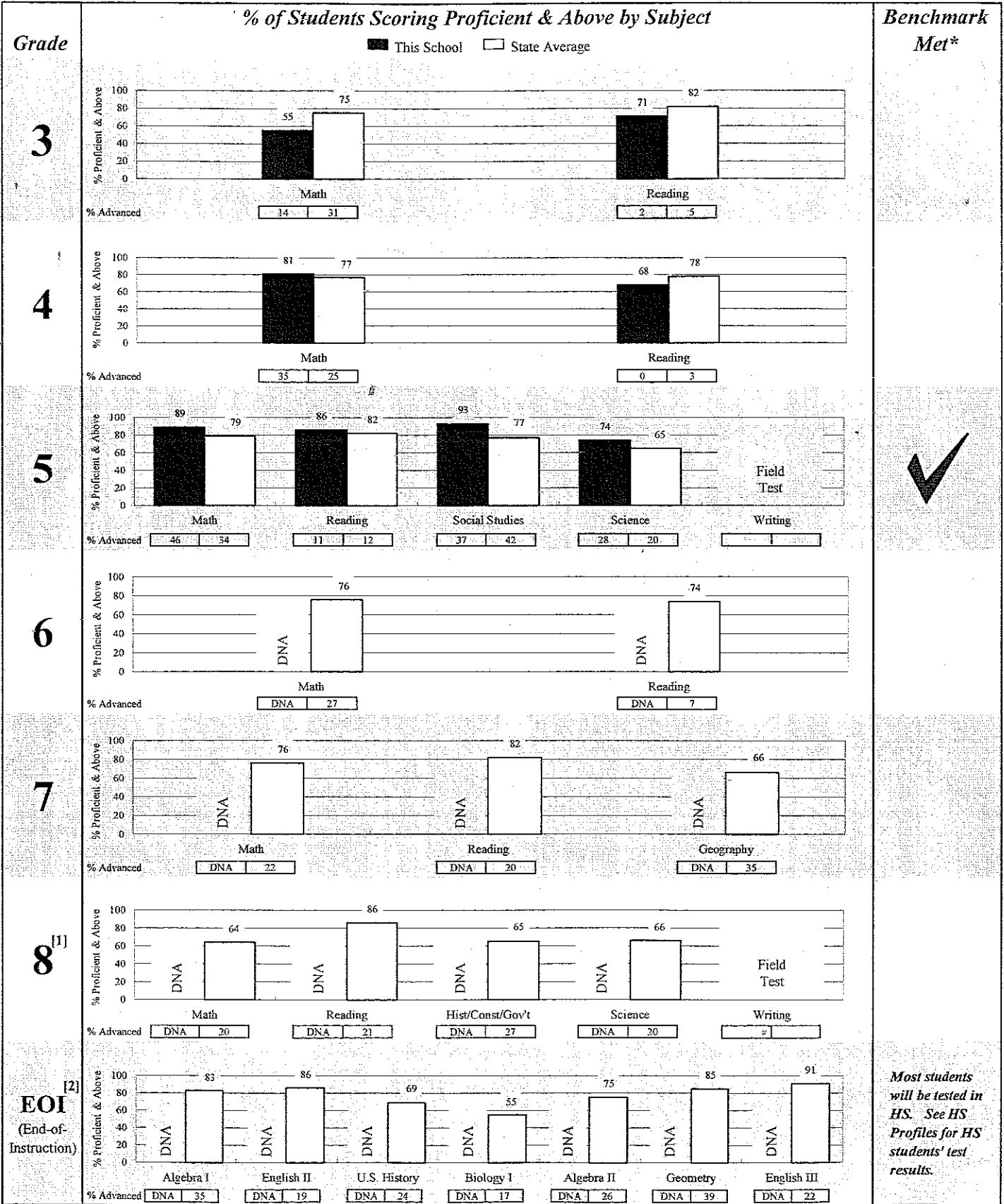

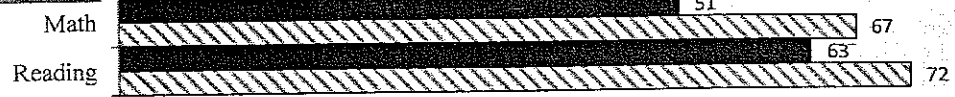

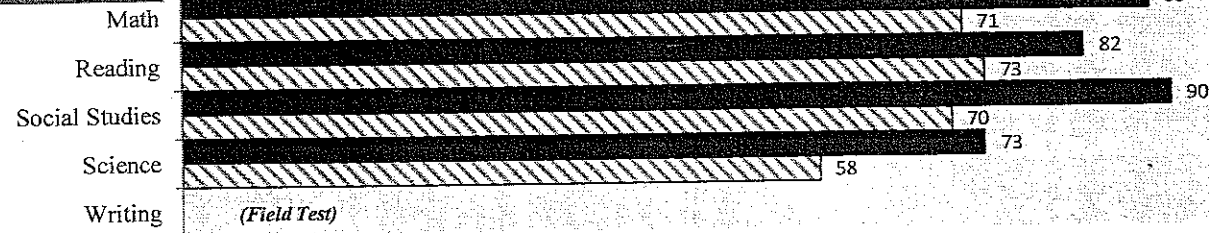
