1. List various communication strategies used in your school to provide additional information to parents and to increase parent and family engagement in supporting classroom instruction.

1. Each teacher will send home a folder containing student papers and work samples each week. Parents will be asked to sign the folder and send it back to school.
2. Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress.
3. Bismarck Elementary will distribute a monthly newsletter to parents that is developed with participation of the parent-school organization, principal, staff, and parent volunteers. It includes school news, a calendar of school activities, and parenting tips related to school achievement such as homework tips, organizational skills, and study skills.
4. Bismarck Elementary will send Standards Based Report Cards every nine weeks regarding their child's progress. At three weeks students that are struggling or below grade level will receive a progress report and at six weeks all students will receive a progress report.
5. Bismarck Elementary will give parents their child's test results and standardized test scores at the first parent-teacher conference and send parents a parent-friendly letter in the first report card that explains their child's test results and standardized test scores.
6. The School will use the student handbook, school web site, signage at the school entrance, and parent orientation meetings about the Schoolwide Title 1 Plan and how to get a copy upon request.
7. Bismarck Elementary will develop community partnerships that will foster a positive relationship between the school and community. Bismarck Elementary will use the partnerships on an as needed basis to enhance and promote community involvement at our school and meet the needs of both students and staff.
8. Parents will be notified of activities at school and will be encouraged to participate in those activities. Bismarck will utilize the school website, email, school-reach, Twitter, Facebook, and other classroom newsletters to keep parents informed.
9. Bismarck's Parent Center will provide books, DVD's, literacy and math materials for checkout. Bismarck Elementary will work to improve the parent center and update materials during the 2018-2019 school year. Parents may use the computer to check grades, and visit educational websites. Parents will be encouraged to view the Title I plan located in the parent resource center or media center. A suggestion sheet will also be available for parental input.
10. Bismarck Elementary will distribute informational packets each year that includes a copy of the school's parental involvement plan, survey for volunteer interests, recommended roles for parents/teachers/students and school, suggestions of ways parents can become involved in their child's education, parental involvement activities planned for the current school year information about the system that will be used to allow parents and teachers to communicate (notes, phone calls, email, etc).
11. Bismarck Elementary will promote and support responsible parenting; the school shall, as funds are available: Purchase parenting books, magazines, and other informative

materials regarding responsible parenting through the school library, advertise the current selection, and give parents the opportunity to borrow the materials for review.

Bismarck Elementary meetings will be held at various times during the day or evening to better accommodate parents. The school will encourage parents in the following types of roles and activities to increase their involvement and support for student learning:

Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in their classrooms on October 25, 2018 and February 21, 2018. Parents will be given a summary of the student test scores and an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will also be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts and explanations of homework and grading

procedures. Flexible conferences will be available to families needing a different option.

3. How will your school provide information to parents about volunteer opportunities (must include state mandated parent training)?

Bismarck elementary school will provide a list of volunteer opportunities and solicit ideas for other types of volunteer efforts during orientation of parents. Teachers will explain the requirements to parents and encourage them to become involved in the school. Brief training sessions by staff will provide parents and community members with the information they need to participate as school volunteers in order to put them at ease and make the experience pleasant and successful.

If the resources they are needing are not available, Whitney Thornton (Parent and Family Engagement Coordinator) will work with their teacher to get the resources needed.

*They will also be given resources and information throughout the year at our Parent and Family Engagement events. Our goal is to keep constant resources and information in the hands of our parents and families.

7. How will your school engage parents in the evaluation of your parent and family engagement efforts?

The School will engage parents in the annual evaluation of the Title I, Part A Program's parental involvement efforts through an annual evaluation using a comprehensive needs assessment filled out by teachers, parents, and school staff. The Title I committee, made up of teachers, parents, and school staff, will determine the effectiveness of the parental involvement plan and make changes if warranted.
