COVID-19 POSITIVE TEST NOTICE TO PUBLIC Sent via email and posted on District website

January 18, 2022

Dear Warren High School parents, faculty and staff:

Since Friday, WISD received confirmation that ten (10) students and three (3) employees assigned to WHS have tested positive for COVID-19. The individuals were last on campus January 12^{th -} 18th. You are receiving this notice, because you or your child was present on the campus in the seven days prior to the individual's diagnosis. We are providing this notice out of an abundance of caution. *Moreover, the Health Department will contact you if you or your child is determined to have been in close contact with the individual.*

Please continue to closely monitor your health. Should you exhibit any symptoms of COVID-19 identified below which indicate a possible infection, contact your health provider immediately. In addition, please consider all other safeguards outlined by the CDC including vaccination, frequent hand washing, social distancing, avoid touching your face or mouth, wearing a mask in public when indoors, staying home if you feel sick, proper respiratory etiquette, and cleaning frequently touched surfaces and objects daily.

Warren ISD will continue operations in compliance with state and local guidance including required daily health screening. Social distancing and increased sanitization practices are encouraged. Regardless of vaccination status, wearing a mask is strongly recommended by the CDC; however, it is a matter of personal choice in WISD. Should you/your student exhibit symptoms of COVID-19, please contact your supervisor/principal and complete the online self-reporting form found on our website.

The health and safety of our students and community remains our top priority, and the District will continue to work closely with the Local Health Department as it responds to individual cases of COVID-19. We would like to remind you that this is a fluid situation and that during the same week, some will be required to quarantine while others are returning from quarantine. We are closely monitoring the number of active cases at each district site and are currently operating in Stage 1 of our mitigation plan. We appreciate your cooperation as we work through these challenges within our Warren ISD community.
