Dr. Hawkins and members of the Livingston School Board attended the txED TASA-TASB Convention held at the end of September in Dallas at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center.

Board members earned their required continuing education credits by attending sessions on everything from educational technologies to advocacy and community engagement.

Short presentations featuring innovative programs by Texas school districts was one of the highlights of the convention.

Roundtable and panel discussions covered varied topics regarding college and career readiness, digital learning and technology integration, assessment and accountability and legislative and education policy.
