Livingston ISD July Board Meeting Summary

The July meeting of the LISD Board of Trustees opened with student recognition. Members of the LHS Royal Brigade Band were recognized for qualifying for competition at the State UIL Solo and Ensemble contest. Drum Major Colby Kesler commended all state competitors on the tremendous amount of preparation required to reach this level of competition. Kesler also recognized Caleb Kesler for his achievement of earning a 1st division at state.

Teddy Kendrick was recognized by Board President Bea Ellis for his achievement of Outstanding Performer in his vocal performance during the Texas State Solo and Ensemble competition. According to Dr. Bradley N. Kent, State Director of Music for the University Interscholastic League (UIL), "Only 2%-3% of the 100,000 students participating in the regional UIL Contests and of the 25,000 performing at the Texas State Solo and Ensemble Contest (TSSEC) receive this distinguished honor. This achievement is truly a mark of musical excellence."

Joel Casiday, LHS student council advisor presented a summary of accomplishments to the board that was achieved by the LHS Student Council during the 2017-2018 school year. This school year marks the third consecutive year the council achieved Sweepstakes Distinguishment in Texas Association of Student Councils (TASC). Livingston is ranked in the top 18% of the 230 state councils. LHS also earned the National Association of Student Council - Gold Council of Excellence Award for the first time. Only 1% of the councils earn this national award. Ranking LHS in the top 1.9% of state councils and the top 1% of the national councils. The Gold Award is only awarded to 199 groups in the nation.

Casiday received the TASC Eddie G. Bull District Advisor of the Year Award for District 17. The membership of the LHS student council has a total of 157 members who focus on student health and safety, foster leadership and give service to the school.

LISD Chief Officer of Curriculum Janan Moore presented the student success report which reflected 98% of LHS students meet the standard of being college and career ready after completing their high school education.

Among the action items approved by the board was the adjunct faculty agreement with the Extension Service, the approval of the Memorandum of Understanding with Angelina College, the T-TESS evaluation appraisers, the student code of conduct and the order for the board of trustees election in November. Also

approved was the interlocal agreement with Polk County and the renewal the property and casualty insurance.
