

REGULATION
ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

In order to be eligible to represent the school in any interscholastic activity the following criteria is required by The Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association.

Semester rule: All students must have passed five subjects in the previous semester. If not, then the student shall be declared ineligible for the first six weeks of the semester and until all grades are passing.

Weekly rule: Students are required to pass all classes on a weekly basis. Teachers are required to notify the principal of students who are failing each Wednesday following the third Wednesday of the semester. Any student failing any subject will be placed on probation for the following week from Monday through Sunday but still be eligible to participate. If all classes are not passing by Wednesday of the probation week, the student will be declared ineligible on a weekly basis until the student is passing all subjects. Eligibility status may be checked in the principal's office the Friday before the activity.

Attendance rule: Students are required to be in attendance 90% of the time in order to be eligible to participate.

Ten day rule: The maximum number of times a student may miss a class for an activity, excluding state and national levels of school competition, is ten per school year. An internal review committee shall be responsible for reviewing and recommending any deviation of this policy.

Only Juniors and Seniors are allowed to invite dates to the Junior-Senior Prom. No students below the 10th grade may be invited. Students must notify the school two weeks prior to the prom of the name and grade of whom they are taking.
