

Procedures for Discontinuing Remote Instruction

Wortham ISD

Wortham ISD will discontinue remote instruction for students who are at a significant risk of learning loss due to a student's attendance and/or academic performance in one or more classes. Specifically, students will not be offered remote instruction if one or both of the following criteria are true in any class:

- Student has a class average of 70 or below
- Student has 3 or more unexcused absences in a grading period.

Prior to discontinuing remote learning, Wortham ISD will:

1. Meet with the parents/guardians to discuss the student's challenges with the current instructional setting and environment
2. Provide parents with 2 weeks' notice prior to requiring the student to come back to campus for face-to-face instruction.

Parents/Guardians may agree to change their child's learning environment to on-campus, or they may appeal the decision in one of two ways:

- Submitting a medical exemption: For a [medical exemption](#), parents must request the exemption in writing to the campus as well as submit a medical authorization that certifies that the student or an individual in the household has a high-risk medical condition as defined by the Centers of Disease Control.
- Requesting a transition meeting with school administration and teachers: Parents may request a transition meeting to appeal the decision to discontinue remote learning. The meeting will occur no sooner than 3 days after the request has been made, and the students may continue to learn remotely until the meeting has been held.
