MCSD Support Plan 2019-2020 School Year

The Magnet Cove School District approves the School Improvement Plans submitted by Magnet Cove Schools for the 2019-2020 school year. The District will allocate all necessary and appropriate fiscal resources and human resources so that each school's plan can be implemented with fidelity in support of targeted areas identified as responses to intervention and professional learning communities.

School District Support Goals

- Magnet Cove School District will support MC Elementary and MC High School in the implementation of the PLC process.
- Magnet Cove School District will support grades K-8 in the implementation of the Capturing Kids' Hearts process.
- Magnet Cove School District will support MC High School (7-12) in response to intervention.

School District Resource Allocation

- Magnet Cove School District will allocate funds from professional development budget and Title I to train administrators and staff (K-8) in the Capturing Kids' Hearts process.
- Magnet Cove School District will allocate resources from operations budget to provide necessary resources to implement professional learning communities and response to intervention.
- NSLA funds will be allocated for District ACSIP Coordinator stipend, and Title I, IV, and IIA funds will be combined to support the schools in response to intervention activities.

School District Actions

- District will monitor the implementation of Professional Learning Communities within each school.
- District will monitor the implementation of Response to Intervention in the schools.
- District will monitor the implementation of the Capturing Kids' Hearts process.
- Monthly district level meetings will be conducted to review data, monitor progress, and adjust plans accordingly.
- District ASCIP Coordinator, Candiss Bennett, will monitor the implementation of each school's improvement plan.

Health and Wellness Assessment Results and Actions

Elementary

Module 1 94%: CHC. 1 Written policy for carry and self-administration of quick-relief medication

Action: Review policy and create forms ascertaining physician to approval for self-administration of medication.

Module 2 82%: A.1 Essential topics on food allergy awareness

Action: Provide literature for students and parents focused on food allergies.

Module 3 85% PA.6 Individualized physical activity and fitness plans

Action: Teach what a fitness plan is and how start one.

Module 4 77% N.7 Promote healthy food and beverage choices and school meals using Smarter Lunchroom techniques.

Action: Display foods in a becoming way. Have a fruit/vegetable of the month to promote.

Module 10 68% CC.2 Parenting strategies (Modeling healthy behaviors)

Action: Sent suggestions/tips on how to model healthy behaviors for children.

Module 11 85% CC.6 Community involvement in improving student health

Action: Ask the Arkansas Department of Health or Dawson Cooperative complete a health related program.

Middle/High School

Module 1 98% N. 11 Fundraising efforts during and outside school hours meet the USDA's Smart Snacks in School nutrition standards.

Action: Prompt sponsors to review other fundraising opportunities that focus on non-food items.

Module 2 77%: CC.7 Do all teachers of health education use assignments or projects that encourage students to have interactions with family and community organizations?

Action: Have one middle and one high school teacher require an assignment that is community or family based.

Module 3 62%: PA.11 Individualized physical activity and fitness plans

Action: Carrie Smith will get in contact with Virtual Arkansas to review the lesson plan.

Module 4 65%: N.13/S.3 Is your school implementing any Farm to School activities?

Action: Collaborate with the Agri Department to make an arrangement for using items grown from the garden and serve in the cafeteria.

Module 10 80% N.1 Student and family involvement in the school meal program and other foods and beverages sold, served and offered on school campus

Action: Have the Wellness Committee provide a student and parent survey that is strongly promoted on social media and in the newsletter.

Module 11 81%: CC.6 Community involvement in improving student health

Action: Ask the Arkansas Department of Health or Dawson Cooperative to complete a health related program.
