Meals will be provided to children without charge and are the same for children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. Forrest City Jr. High School-1133 N. Division Street, Forrest City, AR--3:30-4:00 p.m.

Stewart Elementary School-400 Dawson Road, Forrest City, AR--3:15-4:15 p.m.

Stewart Elementary will serve Monday-Thursday through April 2019. Forrest City High will serve Monday-Wednesday through April 2019. **Central Elementary and Forrest City Jr. High will serve on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday starting Monday, October 15, 2018 through April 2019.**
