

**Summer Food Service Program  
Public Release (REVISED May 30, 2019)**

The Forrest City School District is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all children age 18 and under without charge. The rules are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided on a first come, first served basis Monday through Friday at all locations. **All meals must be eaten on-site.** The sites and service times are:

1. Forrest City High School Cafeteria, 480 Graham Street, 72335 Breakfast 7:30 – 9:00 a.m.; Lunch 11:30 a.m. – 1 p.m. from June 3 - July 26, 2019.
2. Forrest City Junior High School Cafeteria, 1133 North Division, 72335 Breakfast 7:30 - 9:30 a.m.; Lunch 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. from June 3 - July 26, 2019.
3. Stewart Elementary School Cafeteria, 400 Dawson Road, 72335 Breakfast 7:30 - 9:30 a.m.; Lunch 11:30 a.m. – 1 p.m. from June 3 - July 26, 2019.
4. **Central Elementary Cafeteria**, 801 Deadrick Road, 72335 Breakfast 7:30 – 9:00 a.m.; Lunch 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. from **June 3 - July 17, 2019.**

**All sites will be closed Thursday, July 4 and Friday, July 5, 2019 in observance of Independence Day.**
