### **Message from the Principal:**

Dear Parents,

The Oklahoma State Department of Education Office of Educational Quality and Accountability has released the 2016-2017 testing results. This information indicates how our school performed on standardized tests, socioeconomic data, and census data compared to similar community groups and the state as a whole.

During the 2016-2017 school year, Keota Public Schools was under the direction of new administration no longer associated with the school. At that time, the Superintendent directed building principals to implement an 8 period school day reducing individual classroom time to 45 minutes. He also instructed the elementary principal to have math classes in the elementary school conducted on a pullout basis, limiting instruction time to 40 minutes per day. Due to the decrease in classroom instruction, there was an educational impact on our student body.

Under the leadership of Superintendent Mrs. Twylah Morris and Principal Bryan Akins, the 2018-2019 school has been adjusted to increase quality academic time. The high school has returned to a traditional 7 period day with 1 hour blocks of instruction. The elementary has created a schedule allowing the implementation of dedicated reading and math blocks to increase academic instruction in those critical areas to 90 minutes of instruction per day.

In addition to adjusting classroom instructional time to best benefit our student body, the Keota Community passed a bond with the anticipation to purchase new reading curriculum for Pre-K to 6 and math curriculum for the entire district.

There is no comparison of testing scores to previous years at this time due to the state changing testing clients, grades being tested, and the standardized tests in general. If you have any questions regarding this information, please contact school administration.

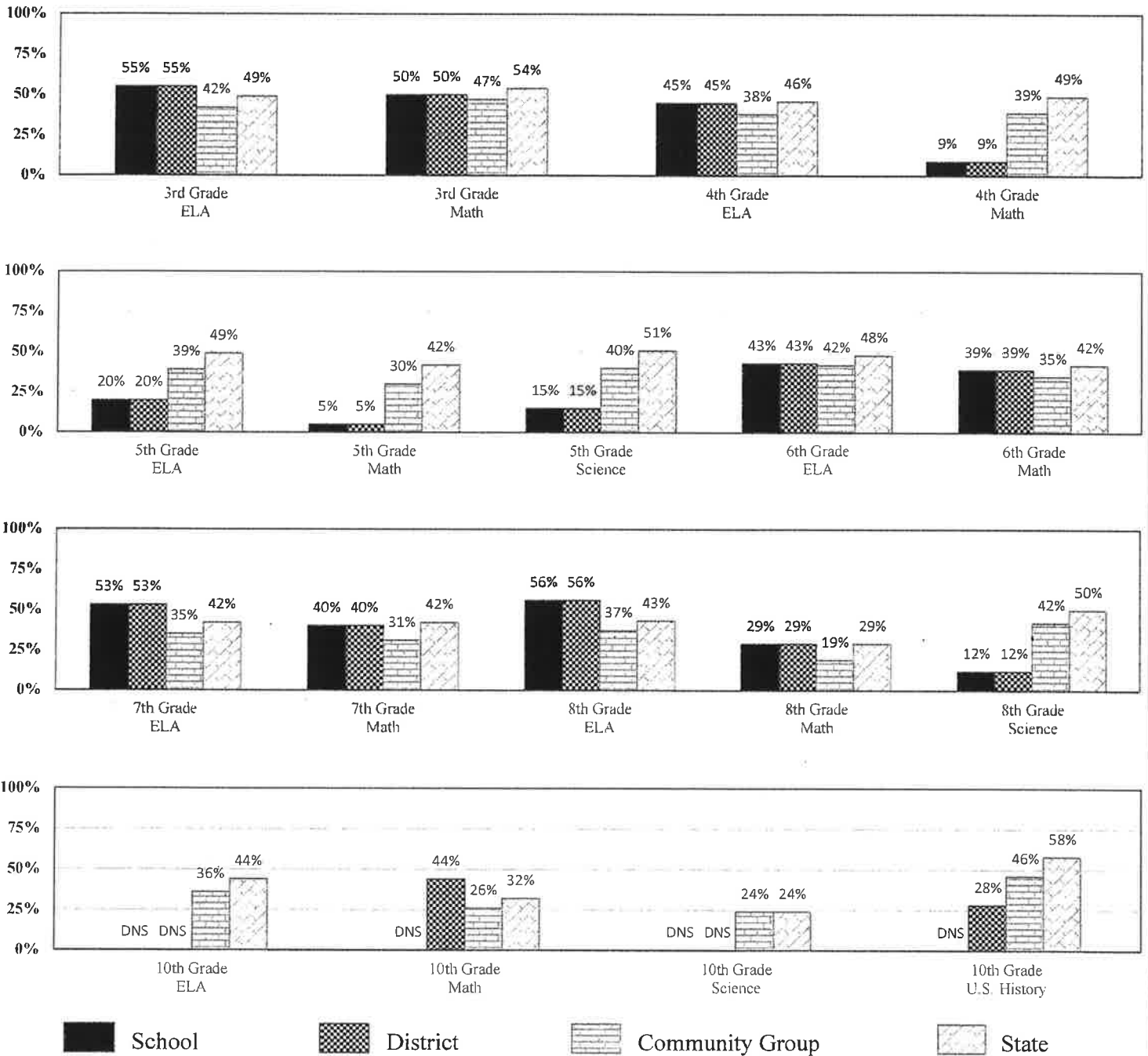

*The state of Oklahoma adopted much higher performance standards in 2017. The test results are therefore not comparable to those from previous years.*

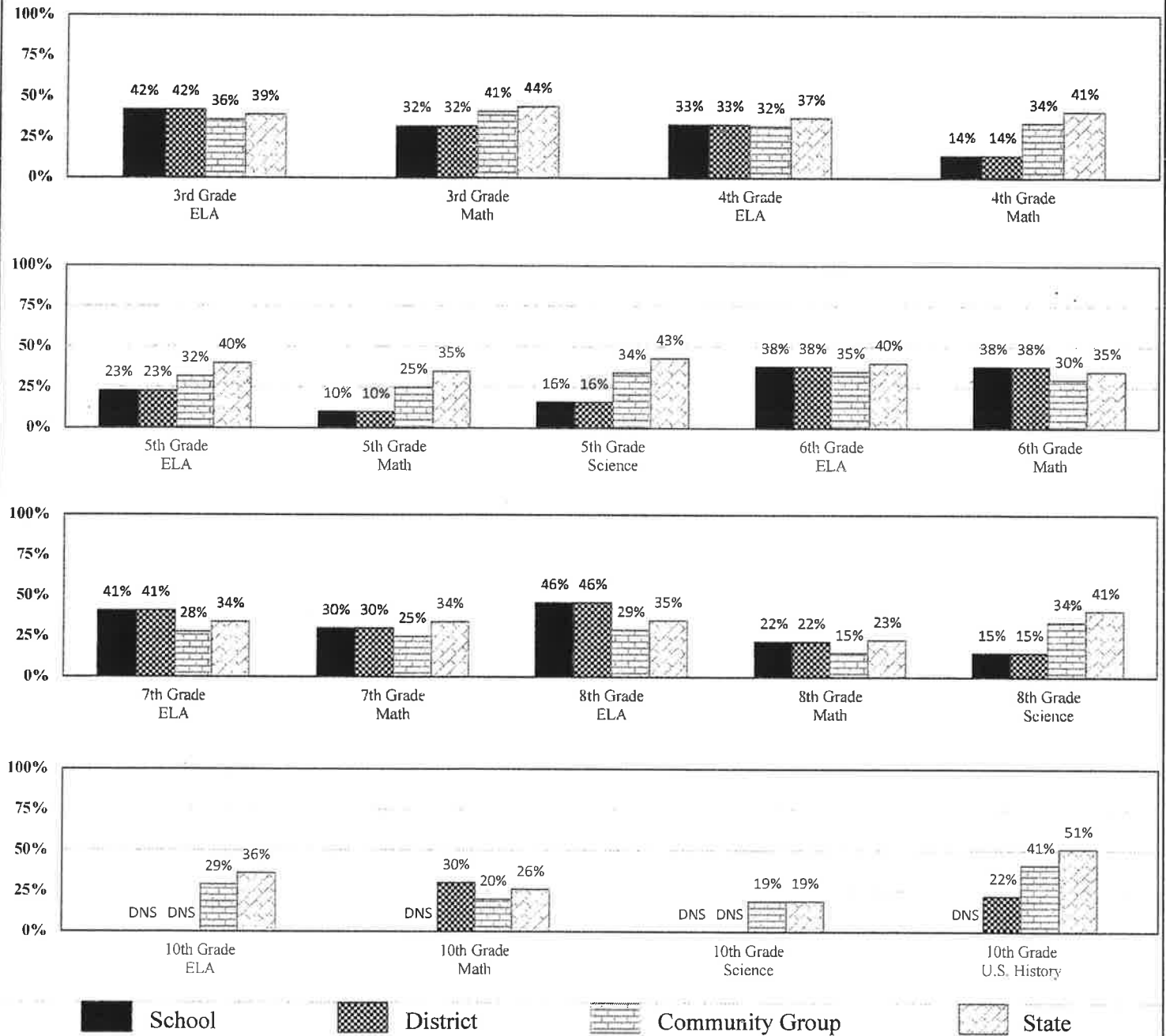
**% of Students Scoring Proficient and Above by Grade and Subject**
