Academic and Behavioral Code of Conduct

As a member of the Bosqueville High School Chapter of the National Honor Society, students are expected to fulfill the following requirements. Students and their parents are expected to read the expectations together and return the signed portion to the chapter adviser by the specified date.

As stated in the national National Honor Society Constitution and By-Laws of the Bosqueville High School Chapter, "The purpose of this organization shall be to create enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote leadership, and to develop character" in the students of secondary schools. Membership in our local chapter is an honor bestowed upon a student. Selection for membership is determined by the Faculty Council and is based on outstanding scholarship, leadership, character, and service.

Members are asked to maintain these standards of conduct. Your signature confirms your awareness of the inherent risk of discipline and dismissal from the National Honor Society should this Academic and Behavioral Code of Conduct be violated.

Members who fall below the standards set forth by the National Constitution and the local chapter by-laws will be warned in writing by the chapter adviser and given a reasonable amount of time to correct the deficiency (example: maintaining grade average). In the case of violation of the law or school rules or the expectations of this Academic and Behavioral Code of Conduct, the member does not need to be warned, and the discipline/dismissal process can be started immediately by the adviser and faculty council.

BHS Chapter of the National Honor Society Academic and Behavioral Code of Conduct Expectations and Eligibility Main Points:

1. Rules and expectations are in effect year round.
2. Membership in the National Honor Society is based upon invitation.
3. Participation is a privilege that carries with it responsibilities to the school, to the student body and to the community. Invitation to become a member of the National Honor Society implies a way of life, with inherent standards and values that students consistently follow. Students will respect themselves, their fellow students, and the Bosqueville High School faculty and staff both on and off campus, including on social media.
4. Students are expected to continue to live and uphold these values and standards if selected for admission and are responsible for reporting any violations they commit to the adviser or a member of the Faculty Council.
5. Based upon the National Honor Society Constitution and by-laws, violations of school rules and/or the law will immediately begin the discipline/dismissal process. These violations include but are not limited to: DUI, stealing, destruction of property, cheating, plagiarism, truancy, or possession, selling, or being under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

We as parents/guardians have read all the information contained in this Academic and Behavioral Code of Conduct and the By-Laws of the Bosqueville High School Chapter of the National Honor Society available on the school website. We support our son/daughter's adherence to the expectations contained in this document and the local chapter by-laws. We also agree to inform the adviser should our son/daughter violate any portion of this code of conduct.
