Timeline

- December 11, 2017 – Bosqueville ISD Board of Trustees adopted a District of Innovation resolution to begin the process to develop a District of Innovation Plan.
- December 11, 2017 – Public Hearing to allow public comment on the proposed District of Innovation planning was held.
- December 11, 2017 – Bosqueville ISD Board of Trustees approved Bosqueville ISD to pursue the District of Innovation designation.
- January 15, 2018 – Bosqueville ISD Board of Trustees approved the District of Innovation Committee.
- January 22, 2018 – Superintendent notified the Texas Education Commissioner of the intention for Bosqueville ISD to pursue the District of Innovation designation.
- January 24, 2018 – The DOI Committee holds first meeting.
- February 21, 2018 – Meeting of DOI Committee to review First Draft of DOI Plan.

INTRODUCTION

During the 84th Texas Legislative Session House Bill (HB) 1842 was passed which allowed Texas Public Schools to formulate a District of Innovation (DOI) Plan. This District of Innovation designation allows eligible school districts to exempt certain provisions of the Texas Education Code (TEC) in an effort to allow local school district flexibility in the district planning and decision-making process.

On December 11, 2017, the Bosqueville ISD Board of Trustees approved a Resolution to explore the development of a District of Innovation Plan in order to increase local control and create the flexibility for the school district to implement practices that will support innovation.

TERM

The term of the (DOI) Plan is for five years, beginning June 1, 2018, and ending May 31, 2023, unless terminated or amended earlier by the Board of Trustees in accordance with the law. If, within the term of this Plan, other areas of operations are to be considered for flexibility as part of (HB) 1842, the Board will appoint a new DOI committee to consider and propose additional amendments to the initial Plan. Any amendment adopted by the Board will not extend beyond the 5-year term the district may not implement two plans at any one time.

AREAS OF INNOVATION: State Law Considered for Exemptions

Bosqueville ISD declares exemption from the below listed statutory provisions, as well as any implementing rules or regulations pursuant to the listed provisions by any state agency/entity, including, but not limited to, the Commissioner of Education, Texas Education Agency (TEA), State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC), and the State Board of Education (SBOE).

1. **School Start Date/End Date** – Texas Education Code (TEC) 25.0811; Texas Education Code (TEC) 25.0812. Board Policy EB(LEGAL).

Currently (TEC) 25.0811 states that a school district may not begin student instruction before the 4th Monday in August. (TEC) 25.0812 states that a school may not schedule the last day of student instruction before May 15th. The current law limits the district's ability to build in any flexibility to the academic school

calendar including unequal semesters, limits opportunities for staff development during the school year, and creates a calendar that does not meet the needs of our students, staff, parents or community.

Input for the proposed academic school calendar will be received from the staff, parents and community. The recommendation for the academic school calendar will be made by the DOI committee for approval by the BISD Board of Trustees.

2. Probationary Contracts – Texas Education Code (TEC) 21.102(b); Texas Education Code (TEC) 21.002. Board Policy DCA(LEGAL).

Currently (TEC) 21.102 states that for teachers new to the district that have taught for five of the past eight years are allowed to remain on a probationary contract for no longer than one year. One year is not a sufficient time to evaluate a teacher's effectiveness and contract renewal timelines result in contract decisions being made prior to receiving state assessment results.

It is proposed that Bosqueville ISD may issue a probationary contract for up to two years for teachers, counselors, and RN's who have been employed by another school district for five of the last eight years. This will allow the district a more effective timeline to evaluate these employees. All BISD employees are evaluated annually.

3. Admission, Transfer, and Attendance (Inter-District Transfers) – Texas Education Code (TEC) 25.036. Board Policy FDA(LOCAL).

Currently (TEC) 25.036 allows a school district to accept transfers who do not reside within the school district boundaries. Currently (TEC) 25.036 is interpreted to require a school district to keep a transfer student for an academic school year once the student has been accepted for transfer.

Bosqueville ISD transfer criteria requires the student applying for transfer to have met the state compulsory attendance guidelines and to have a discipline record with no serious offenses. Bosqueville ISD is requesting to amend FDA(LOCAL) Board policy to allow a transfer student's standing in the District to be revoked at any time during the academic school year if the student falls below the 90% compulsory attendance requirement or if the student commits a serious discipline offense that results in (in/out of school suspension or placement into a DAEP setting).

4. School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) – Texas Education Code (TEC) 28.004. Board Policy BDF(LEGAL).

Bosqueville ISD is proposing to have the (SHAC) committee meet at least one time per school year. BISD's size and the difficulty maintaining a stable membership do not support the need for the current four required meetings per year. The district will ensure that student needs that are affected by the (SHAC) committee decisions will continue to be met.

5. Teacher Certification – Texas Education Code (TEC) 21.003; Texas Education Code (TEC) 21.053; Texas Education Code (TEC) 21.057. Board Policy DBA(LEGAL)/(LOCAL); DK(LEGAL)/(LOCAL).

Currently (TEC) 21.003 states that a person may not be employed as a teacher, teacher intern or trainee, librarian, educational aide, administrator, educational diagnostician, or school counselor by a school district unless the person holds an appropriate certificate permit issued by the appropriate state agency.

(TEC) 21.053 requires a teacher to present his or her certificate to the District before their employment contract will be binding, and prohibits the District from paying an educator for teaching if the educator does not hold a valid certificate at the time.

(TEC) 21.057 requires that the District provide written notice to parents if an inappropriately-certified or non-certified teacher is assigned to a classroom for more than 20 consecutive instructional days.

*Please Note: This exemption will not be allowed in the area of Bilingual or Special Education teachers. The teachers employed in these areas must continue to be SBEC certified in those teaching fields.

Bosqueville ISD is proposing to be able to employ an individual with experience in the content area of CTE elective courses to teach through a local teaching certificate. The campus principal would specify in writing the purpose for the request and would present the person's educational and work experience that would qualify them to teach the proposed course(s). Example: A certified electrician to teach a CTE on electrical trades, a licensed welder to teach CTE welding courses, an RN to teach health science courses.

Bosqueville ISD is proposing to allow a current certified teacher to teach out of their area of certification. Bosqueville ISD will continue to seek teacher's certified for the specific position, but when not possible the district will seek the best possible candidate to fill the position. Examples of this scenarios include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Allow a teacher certified in elementary grades to teach Kindergarten

- Allow a teacher certified through 6th grade to teach 7th & 8th grade courses
- Allow a teacher certified in middle/high school grades to teach at the elementary grades

Bosqueville ISD will require the campus principal to specify in writing the purpose for the request and would present the person's qualifications that would make them the appropriate candidate for the position.
