## **Comprehensive Needs Assessment**

#### **Demographics:**

Vernon Middle school will work on increasing the attendance rate for each grade level. We will continue to address the students who have excessive amounts of absences through an attendance plan. The middle school is also working to address the needs of the growing population of English Language Learners.

#### Student Achievement:

In 2015-2016, Vernon Middle School met the state standards for all four indexes. We received a distinction award in 8th grade social studies. The school will address the areas of Hispanics, African Americans and the Economically Disadvantaged students to meet the necessary requirements.

We will continue to address the needs for the Level III, Final Level II, and Phase in 2 Level II students in all subject areas. The Middle School will be using instructional strategies from Fundamental Five, Avid, and participating in the Marizano's High Reliability Schools program for the second year.

#### **School Culture & Climate:**

The middle school has a high participation rate in extracurricular activities for student involvement. We will continue to monitor the programs for student participation and to address needs for the programs to be successful.

We will continue to examine student behavior and focus on discipline strategies to minimize the loss of instructional time for students.

#### Staff Quality, Recruitment, and Retention:

All staff at VMS is Highly Qualified for the 2016-2017 school year. New teacher academy is provided by the district and teachers have access to Region 9 for outside Professional development on a regular basis based upon student and teacher need. The campus will provide mentors for all first year teachers and new teachers to the campus.

The campus administration will continue to monitor staff morale through support and campus communication to maintain staff personnel.

### **Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment:**

In 2016-2017, Vernon Middle School continued the use TEKS Resource System as the vehicle to drive instruction, provide common assessments, and deliver the TEKS to students in a systemic way insuring all TEKS are covered before the State Assessment. VMS made a concerted effort to insure teachers have quality time to plan with their subject area colleagues. This allows the teams to review the data from their assessments and discuss instructional strategies that meet the needs of students.

### **Family and Community Involvement:**

The district has provided opportunities to address the need for parental involvement through social media (Facebook and twitter), the district and campus websites. The teachers and campus administration are using remind, social media, local radio station, local newspaper, and google classroom to increase their communication with the parents and community. The district also provides parenting classes to address attendance issues once a month.

#### **School Context and Organization:**

The Vernon Middle School administration is here to provide campus support for all grade levels and programs. Teachers are elected to serve on the campus site base team to make campus decisions.

The campus provides a time for the content area to meet to prepare and discuss instructional strategies and results from assessments.

### Technology:

All teachers have access to a wide variety of equipment, which includes a computer, chromebook, three computer labs, document camera, InFocus, digital cameras (15), chromebooks (24) and mimeo boards, if they complete the training. Training on the use of the devices was provide by the district instructional technologist.

#### **Programs:**

The AVID Program has begun this year and will be monitored throughout the year. STAR Math and STAR Reading are being used to identify students strengths and areas of concerns for teachers to develop lessons and tutorials.

The middle school provides many extracurricular activities for student involvement.
