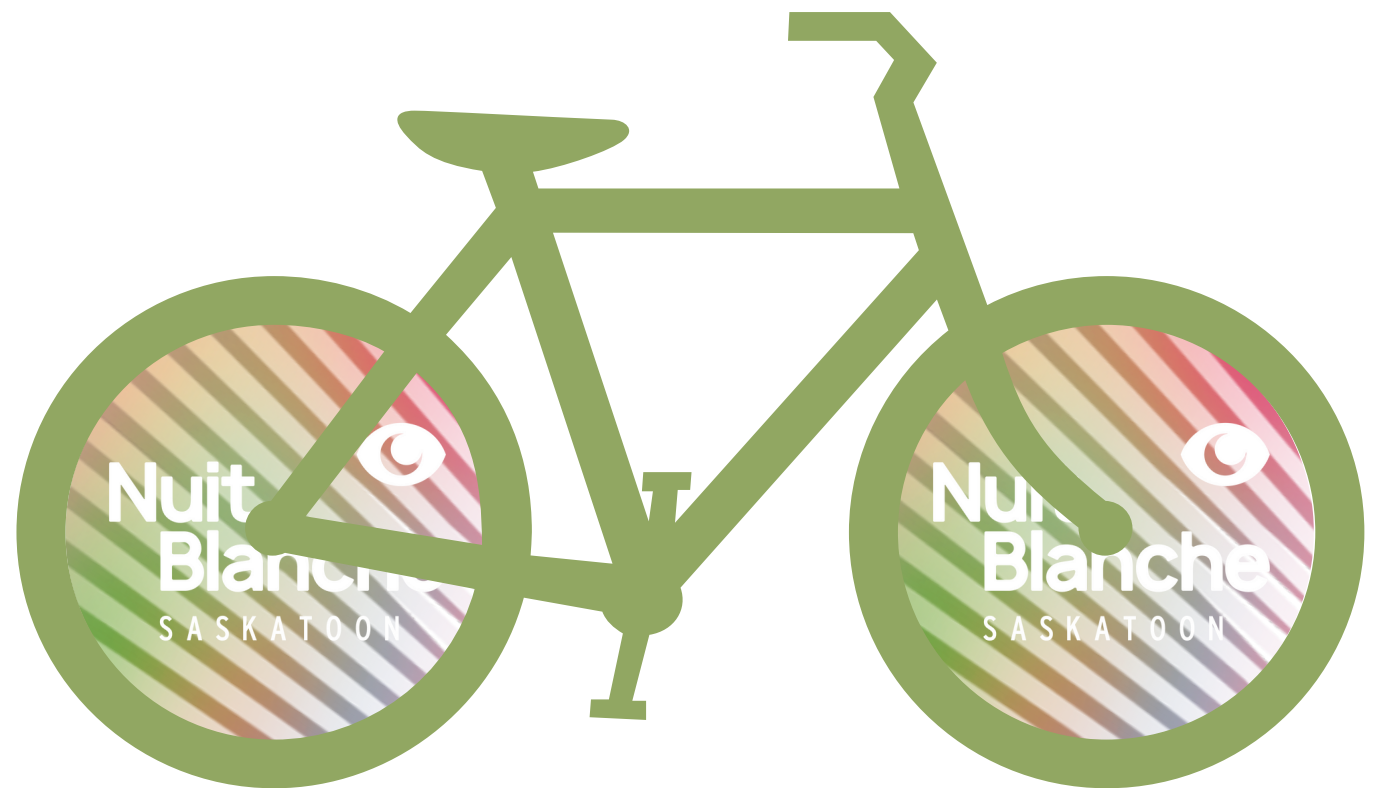


Cycle NBYXE





Cycle Nuit Blanche Saskatoon!

Nuit Blanche Saskatoon takes over the streets of Broadway, Downtown, and Riversdale for one night only on Saturday, September 23rd from 7:00 PM until midnight. **Cycling is one of the best ways to experience the entire Nuit Blanche Saskatoon Festival.** Whether cycling alone, in a group, or as part of our Saskatoon Cycles Glow Roll, use this guide to plan a safe cycling journey.

- Lock up your bike when not riding



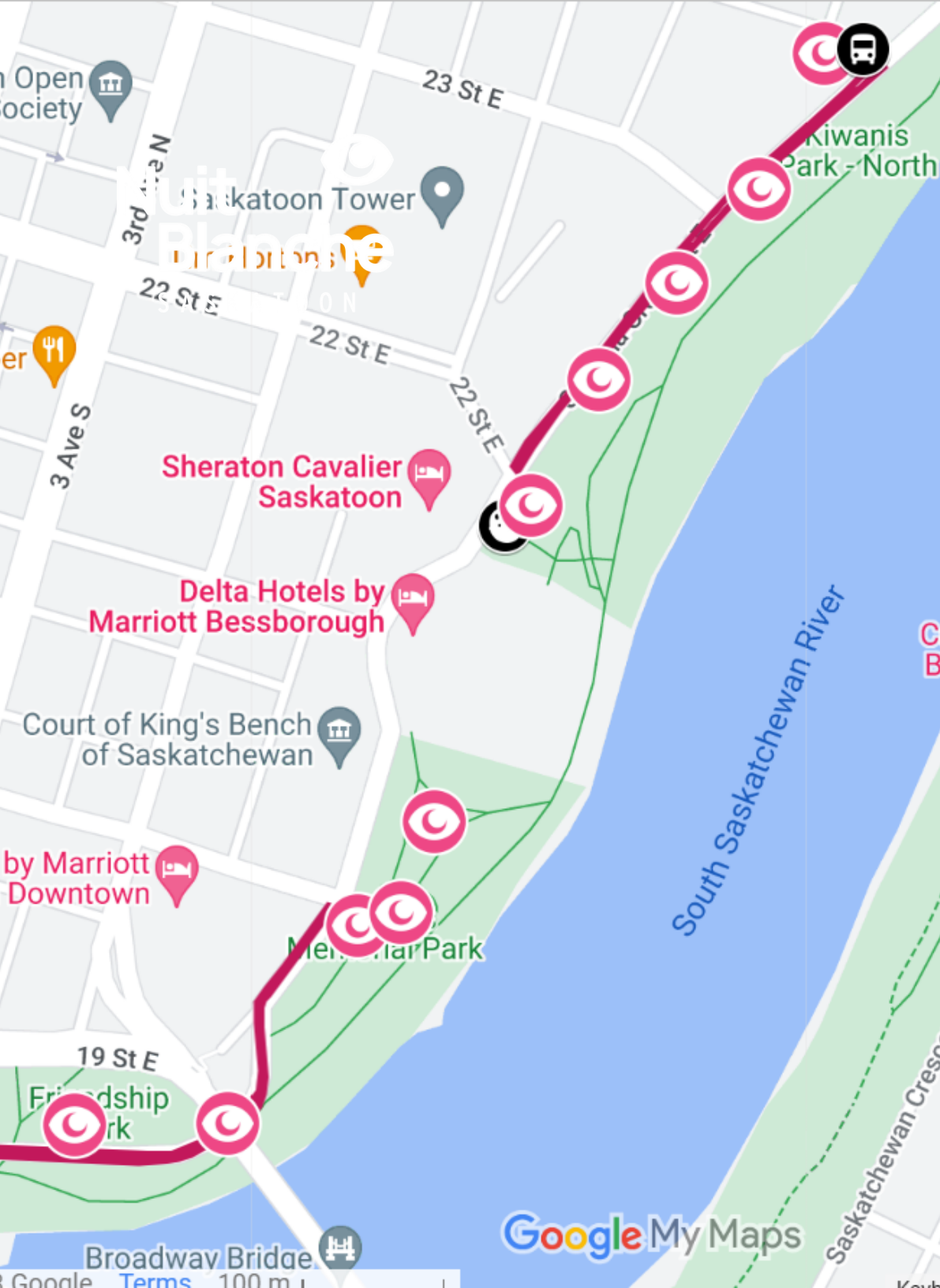
Join the Saskatoon Cycles Glow Roll!

We've partnered with Saskatoon Cycles to lead a Glow Roll through the entire NBYXE festival, using the route in this guide. Everyone is welcome to join!

Meet at 7:00 PM at St Johns Cathedral (816 Spadina Crescent). The Glow roll will start with an introduction to the festival and some safe biking tips. The slow roll will start promptly at 7:15. Consider lighting up your bike to become a part of Saskatoon's most illuminating festival!

Neighbourhood #1: Downtown (Spadina)

NOTE: Parts of Spadina will be closed to vehicle traffic, but respectful cycling is permitted.

Start at the St Johns Cathedral (816 Spadina Crescent E) with a tour of the Museum of the Moon in the Cathedral.

- Feel free to visit the Ukrainian Museum of Canada, open late for NBYXE23

From St Johns Cathedral, follow Spadina down and around the Bessborough, stopping to view all the installations along the pathway.

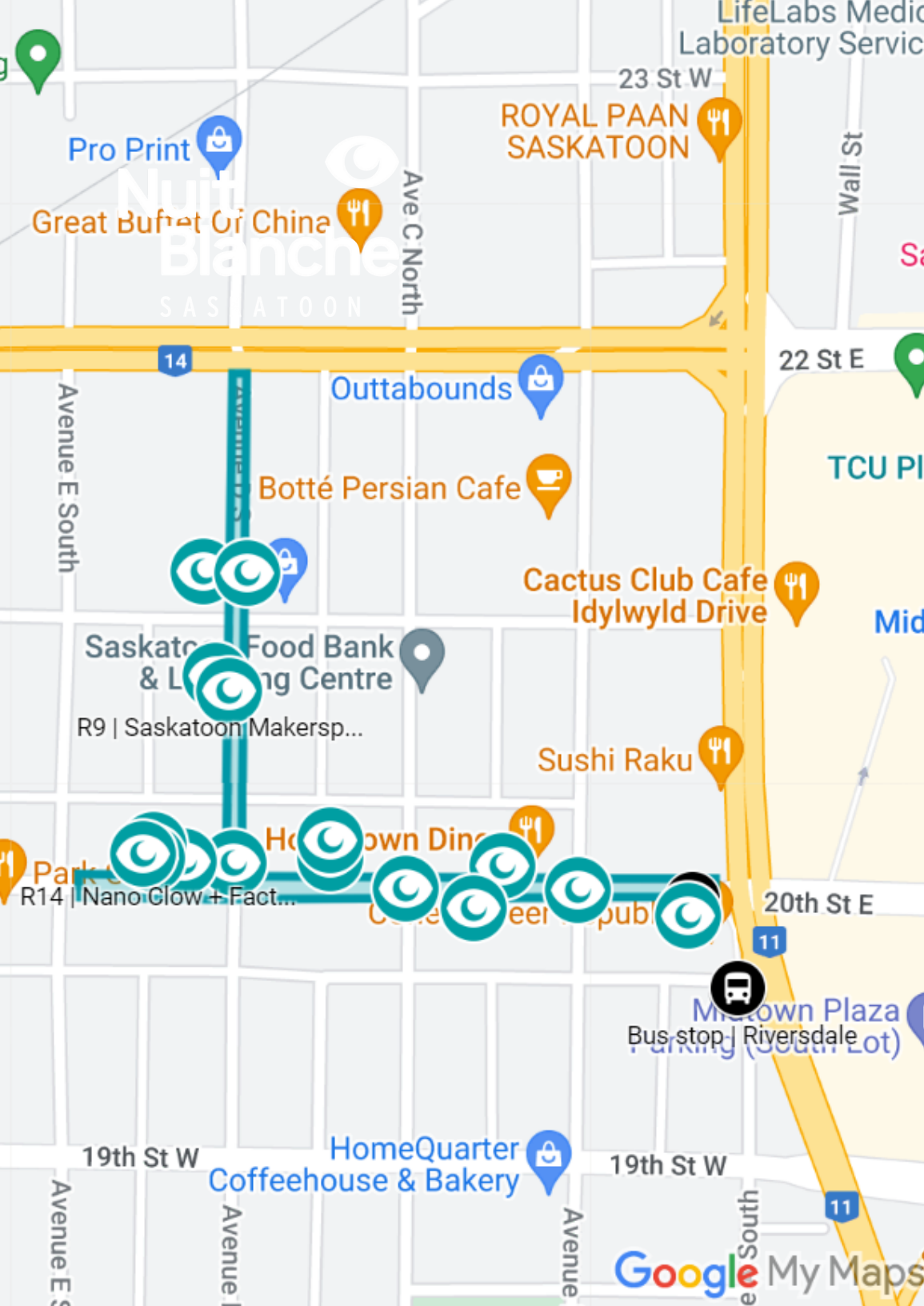

Cycle around the front of the Bessborough and find three installations in Kiwanis Park

View Jesse Fulcher Gagnon's project under the Broadway Bridge, and check out 'L"Δ"6' Mahihkanak: St Frances Dance Troupe in Friendship park.

Leaving the Neighbourhood:

- At the Founder's Statue (Downtown-side of the Traffic Bridge) bike to 19th Street.
- Turn right at Avenue A (Junior Cafe).
- Take Avenue A to 20th Street.



Neighbourhood #2: Riversdale

NOTE: 20th Street and Avenue D will be closed to vehicle traffic, but cycling is permitted.

The Riversdale projects and installations can be viewed starting at the Nuit Blanche Info tent (near Idylwyld) to Avenue E.

- Note: The Colin Grant Quartet featuring Dash Reimer and our Spoken Word Stage is located in the Roxy Theatre
- Note: Edie Skeard and Nano Clow/ Factor 8 will be located in PAVED arts.

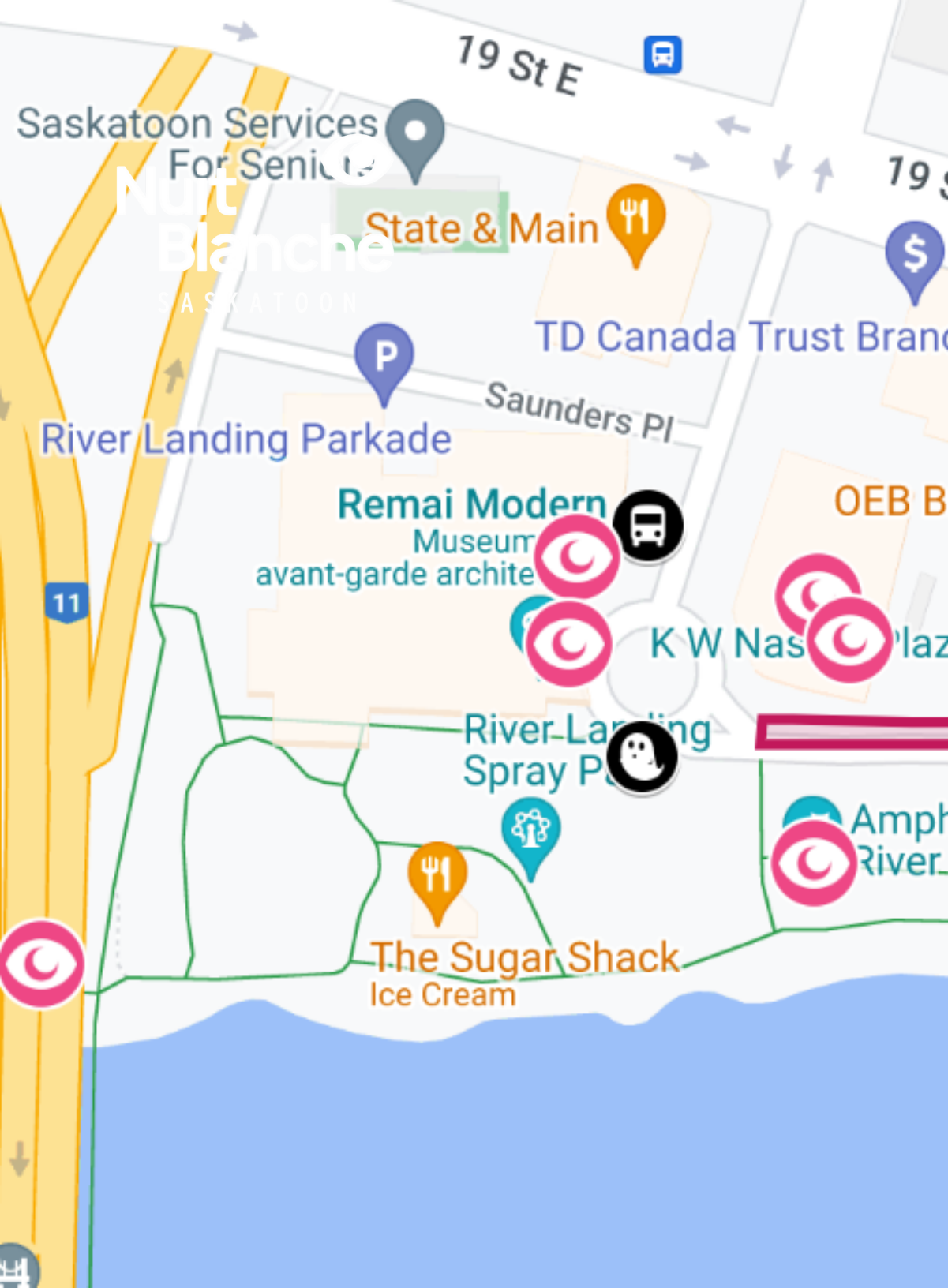
Once you have reached Avenue E, turn back and take a left to travel down Avenue D.

Parking Options.

- Bike racks are found along 20th Street.
- There is a bike parking patio on 20th Street between Ave B and C.



Neighbourhood #3: River Landing

Head back towards Idylwyld and take Avenue A down to the River Landing pathway.

Underneath the Sid Buckwold Bridge is our first installation on River Landing.

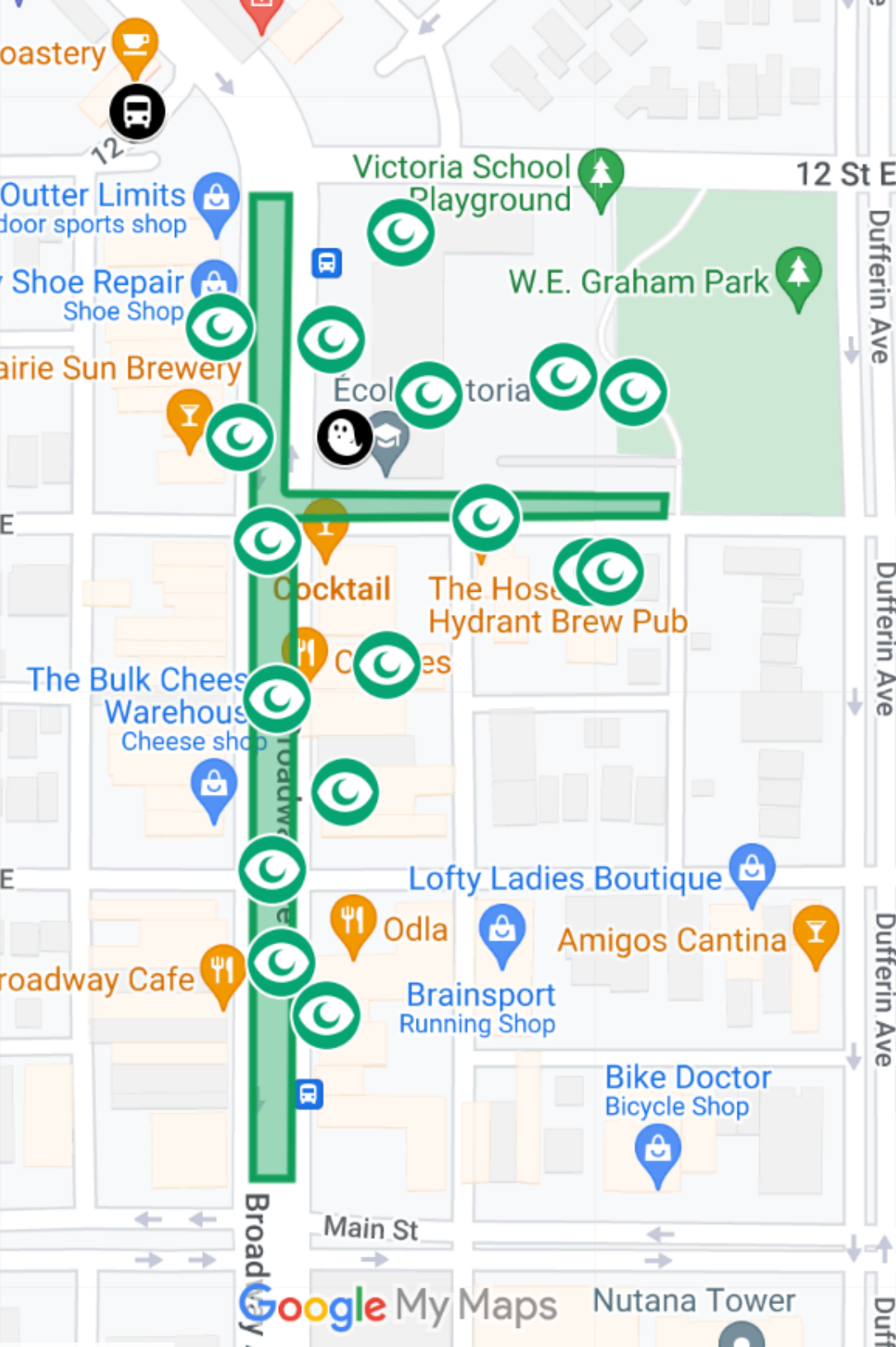
The next installation can be found on the River Landing Amphitheatre.

The remaining projects on River Landing are all found inside buildings, so parking your bike is advised.

- Remai Modern- you can build a lantern with Persephone Theatre, and check out the Connect Gallery.
- Alt Hotel is housing works by Negar Devine-Targardan (in the Bokeh lounge) and Beautiful Science (part of Global Biotech Week) can be found in the Indigo Lounge on the 2nd floor.

Once you've seen all the River Landing installations, take the Traffic Bridge across the river, and take a left on 11th Street.



Neighbourhood #4: Broadway

NOTE: Broadway will be closed to vehicle traffic between 12th Street and Main Street, but respectful cycling is permitted.

Once you land on Broadway, check out the installations around Ecole Victoria School.

Leaving Ecole Victoria park, travel down 11th Street and see two more installations.

Finally, take in all the installations on Broadway Avenue.
