New school and village construction, small business opportunities, and backing for survivors who had not received aid from the "big" NGO's were prioritized. House, business or boat recipients worked alongside Foundation volunteers to construct their own and other survivors' projects, and in the process, learned valuable life skills useful for supporting their surviving families and assisting others in a devastated tourist economy.

Over 140 tsunami orphans were tracked to their new homes all over Thailand and enrolled in 4Kali Foundation's "Support a Child" program. Long term donors from across the globe found to financially sponsor each child. When the Foundation closed in 2009, all remaining financial and office and construction assets were donated to Petra Nemcova's 501c3 "Happy Hearts Fund" and a local Thai NGO. These organizations oversaw the "Support a Child Program" to enable the program to continue serving the needs of the tsunami orphans until they finished their education and became financially independent.
