# Fabricated Gear Manufacturing

Steve Carter graduated from California Polytechnic State University in San Luis Obispo, California in 1972. He joined Westinghouse Marine Division in Sunnyvale where he worked on nuclear components for the Fast Flux Testing Facility at Hanford, WA, Missile Launching and Handling Equipment for the Trident submarine, land steam turbines, qualification of numerous welding procedures, including the introduction of Flux-cored Welding and Electroslag Welding. He also worked for Bucyrus Erie (B-E) in Pocatello, Idaho, the maker of the world's largest mining machinery, where he instituted a program of fabricating gears to replace cast gears.

Steve moved to Washington and worked for Western Gear, Nicholson Manufacturing, Ace Tank and Equipment, Scott Paper, Precor Fitness and lastly Exotic Tool Welding. Although retired, Steve does welding consulting, inspection and fabrication in his shop.

Steve Carter is part of the original group of the first CWIs, obtaining his his certification in the second round of testing in 1977.

The presentation will cover the development of both new fabricated gears and the "rebanding" of old cast gears while at B-E.
