

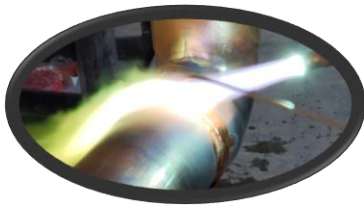

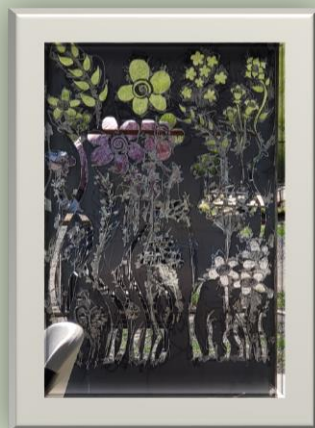

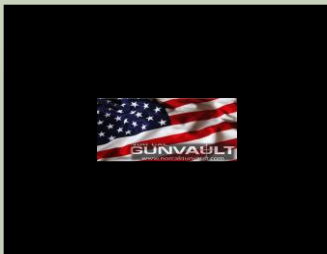

The facility will house a permanent welding and manufacturing center and will increase welding and manufacturing educational programs to meet industry demands.

The college's welding program has been recognized nationally and statewide as a premiere technical education program. The new facility will include four classrooms, two dedicated welding labs with 92 welding stations, a dedicated state-of-the-art manufacturing lab, rod storage, tank storage, and a large outdoor laboratory. The building will include 59,525 square feet. In addition, the facility will include a rooftop solar system. The plan is to install enough renewable energy to off-set the added consumption to help prevent additional on-going utility costs to the District.
