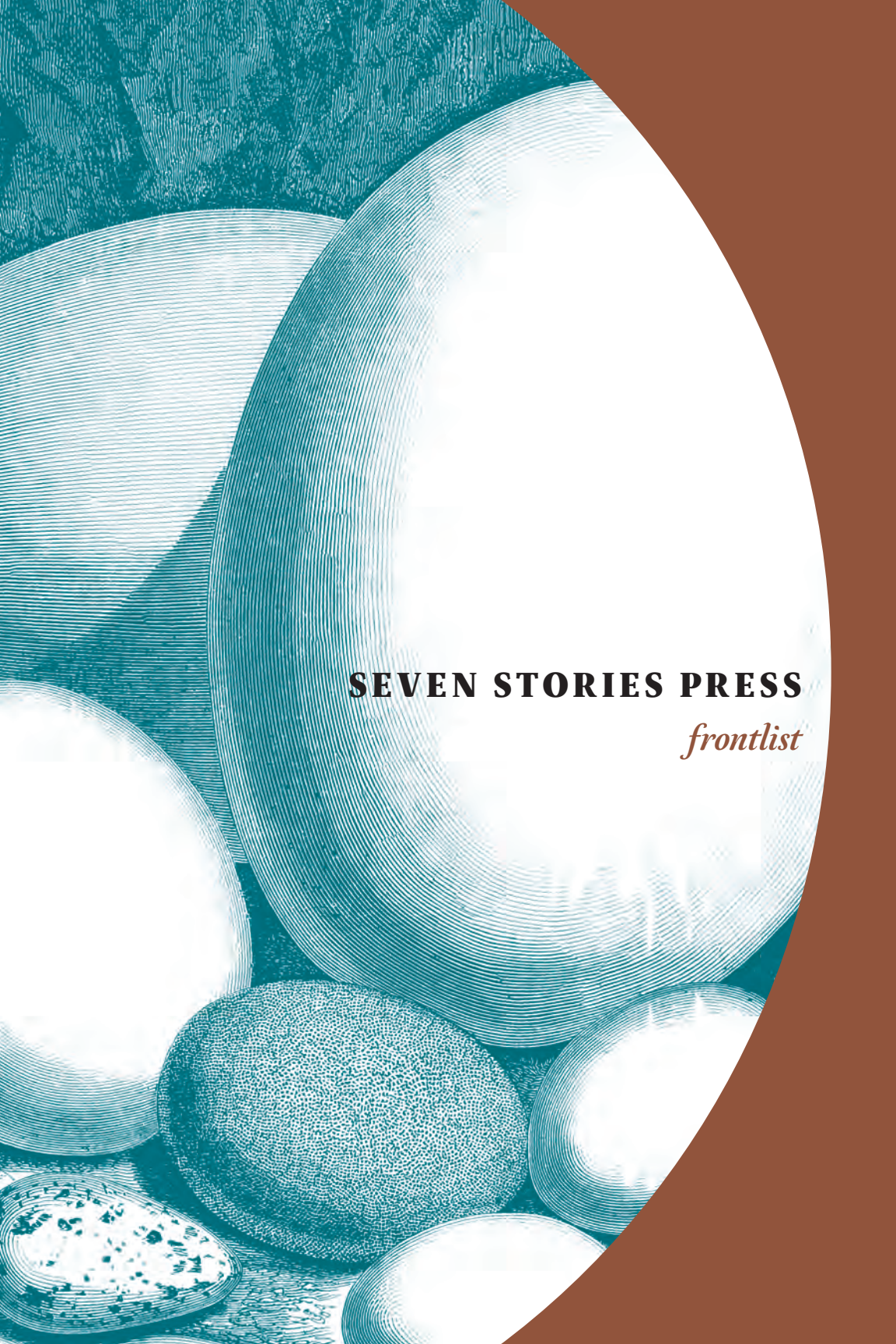

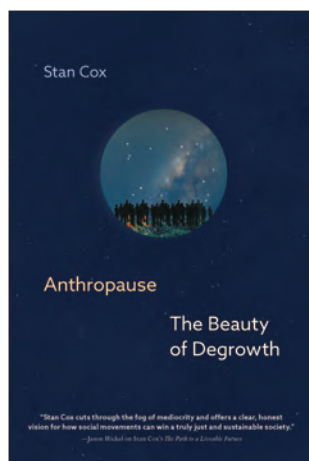

In the spring of 2020, people worldwide found themselves confined at home in response to pandemic lockdown orders, and scientists documented how quickly nature flourished in response to less human activity, calling the phenomena an “anthropause.” As we approach the tipping point toward irreversible climate catastrophe, Stan Cox argues that by embracing degrowth, we are not turning our backs on progress; instead, we are redefining it. *Anthropause* shows us how we and the living world will flourish if we succeed.

STAN COX is the author of *The Green New Deal and Beyond* (2020), *The Path to a Livable Future: A New Politics to Fight Climate Change, Racism* (2021), and *The Next Pandemic* (2021). His writing about the economic and political roots of the global ecological crisis has been published by *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, and *Al Jazeera*, as well as local publications across the United States.

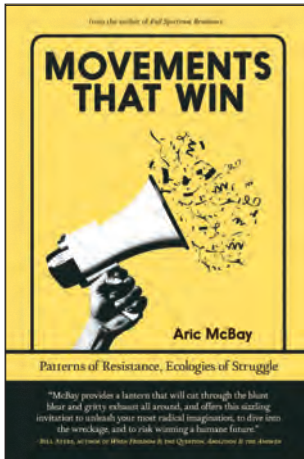

As the world slides further toward authoritarianism and the prospects for advancing social justice through electoral democracy narrow, the power of communities to prevail against strongman politics and corporate domination becomes increasingly crucial. Building on the analysis presented in Aric McBay's two-volume set *Full Spectrum Resistance, Movements that Win* features successful real-world social movements like "Shut Down Canada" and "Revolution of the Heart" that display the creative innovations, bravery, and persistence of those who take risks to organize their communities to confront the injustices of greed, militarism, and racism.

Community organizer, organic farmer, digital game developer, and writer **ARIC MCBAY** is the author of *Full Spectrum Resistance, vol 1 & 2* (2019), as well as the speculative novels *Kraken Calling* (2022) and *Inversion* (2023). McBay writes and speaks on numerous social justice issues and has organized successful campaigns around fossil-fuel pipelines, indigenous solidarity, unionization, and prisoner justice, among other causes.

In 1936, eighteen-year-old Isidro Elejalde leaves his Basque village in Northern Spain to fight to preserve his country's democracy from insurrectionists who launched a military coup to overthrow Spain's newly elected left-wing government. The insurrectionists assume the population will welcome the coup, but throughout the country people like Isidro remain loyal to the ideals of democracy, and the Spanish Civil War begins.

In Bilbao, Mariana raises her two young children while writing missives that decry the fascist-backed coup attempt and their German and Italian allies. As the Nationalist forces assault the country, Mariana and Isidro's lives intersect fleetingly, yet in meaningful and lasting ways.

JULIAN ZABALBEASCOA's stories have appeared in *American Short Fiction*, *Boulevard*, *The Common*, *Electric Literature*, *The Gettysburg Review*, *Glimmer Train*, *One Story*, and *Ploughshares*, and his interviews and reviews have been published in *The Believer*, *The Millions*, and *Salamander*. His debut novel *What We Tried to Bury Grows Here* was a *Los Angeles Times* Book Prize Finalist.

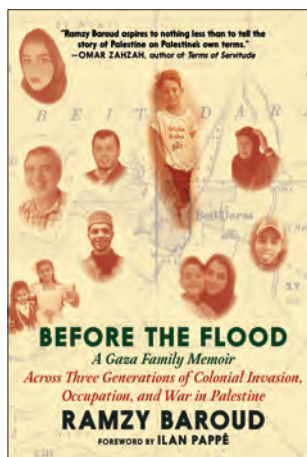

Ramzy Baroud has written a profound exploration of Palestinian history as told through the stories of his own family, the al-Badrasawis. He evokes day-to-day village life in Beit Daras prior to the Nakba and the struggle to maintain autonomy in the face of British colonialism and Zionist aggression. Baroud weaves together ancestral history, recent past and present, describing the historical forces that have shaped the resilience of Palestinian people. His storytelling reveals not only the realities of displacement, military occupation, and siege, but also the courage and enduring unity that underpin the spirit of Palestinian resistance.

Palestinian activist and journalist **RAMZY BAROUD** is the author of *Searching Jenin* (2003), *The Second Palestinian Intifada* (2006), *My Father Was a Freedom Fighter* (2010), *The Last Earth* (2018), and *These Chains Will Be Broken* (2019). He is the editor of *Palestine Chronicle* (1999–present), former managing editor of *Middle East Eye*, and former deputy managing editor of *Al Jazeera Online*. Baroud’s writing can be found in *The Washington Post*, *Arab News*, *Japan Times*, and *The Cairo Review*, among other publications.

Historian and socialist activist **ILAN PAPPÉ** is the author of *The Ethnic Cleansing of Palestine* (2007), *A History of Modern Palestine* (2022), *The Idea of Israel: A History of Power and Knowledge* (2014), and co-author with Noam Chomsky of *Gaza in Crisis: Reflections on Israel’s War Against the Palestinians* (2010).

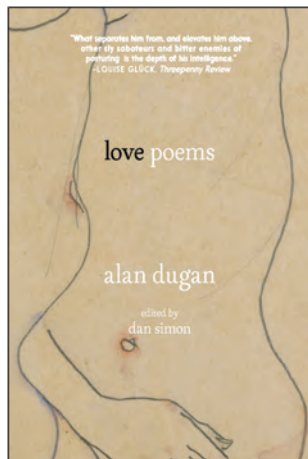
Caustic, lustful and dark, here are twenty-nine poems from the great Irish-American poet Alan Dugan that convey the undying power of love as a healing force.

ALAN DUGAN (1923–2003) won the Yale Series of Younger Poets prize and his first National Book Award for his debut book, *Poems* (1961). Each subsequent book was titled *Poems* again, followed by a number in sequence. His last volume, *Poems Seven* (Seven Stories, 2001), won Dugan his second National Book Award. Dugan also won the Pulitzer Prize, the *Prix de Rome*, and an award in literature from the American Academy and the Institute of Arts and Letters.

Founder and publisher of Seven Stories Press **DAN SIMON** is the author of the novel *Ashland* (2026) and is co-author, with Jack Hoffman, of *Run Run Run: The Lives of Abbie Hoffman*.

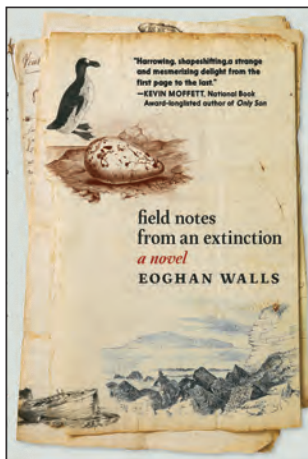

Field Notes from an Extinction

A Novel

EOGHAN WALLS

Written in the form of a 19th-century notebook of ornithological observations, *Field Notes from an Extinction* follows Ignatius Green, an English scientist dispatched to a remote island off the northern Irish coast to study the Great Auk. However, Green’s world is shattered when his monthly delivery of goods arrives ravaged and, to his surprise, with a small child. His fury is matched only by his dismay at the local Irish townsmen’s growing restlessness and hunger. Even more, there is talk sweeping the land of a terrifying woman with preternatural power. As Green fights to survive, we come to discover the story of one man’s growing humanity amidst famine, the threat of extinction, and social unrest.

Northern Irish poet **EOGHAN WALLS** is the author of the novel *The Gospel of Orla* (Seven Stories, 2023) and two poetry collections, *The Salt Harvest* (2011) and *Pigeon Songs* (2019). His poetry has been shortlisted for multiple international awards, including the Bridport Prize and the Manchester Poetry Prize. In 2021, he published the first major translation of Heidegger’s poetical works, *Thought Poems: A Translation of Heidegger Verse*.

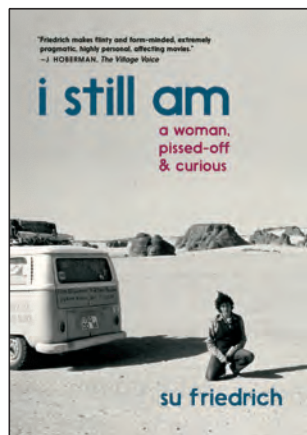

SU FRIEDRICH

In 1976, 21-year-old Su Friedrich embarked on a transformative six-month solo trip through nine countries in North and West Africa. From her letters, diary entries, and the indelible images captured in black and white on her 35mm Olympus, an enduring travel story unfolds.

As she documents her day-to-day encounters with the people she meets from Algeria to Morocco (during the Western Sahara War), Burkina Faso to Nigeria (during a coup), Friedrich not only weaves a rich tapestry of Africa in the mid-1970s, but also imbues each page with her thoughts, feelings, and discoveries at this moment of tremendous ferment.

SU FRIEDRICH's filmography includes *The Ties that Bind* (1985), *Hide and Seek* (1996), *Gut Renovation* (2012), among many others. Her landmark film, *Sink or Swim* (1990), was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry by the Library of Congress. Friedrich is the recipient of the Cal Arts Alpert Award in the Arts and has received fellowships from the Rockefeller Foundation and John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. Her most recent film is *Today* (2022).

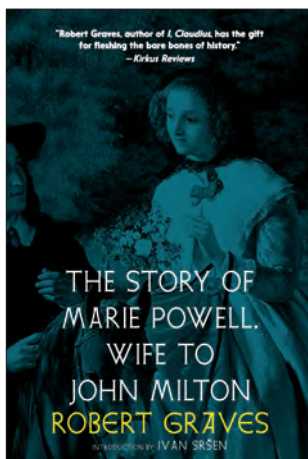

The Robert Graves Project spans fourteen titles and includes fiction and nonfiction, adult, young adult, and children's books, with new introductions and afterwords, from the polymathic, eccentric genius of Robert Graves.

In 1640s England was a hotbed of clashing ideologies and so too was the marriage of Mary Powell and John Milton. Their reimagined story, which unfolds in Marie's sensitive and searching journal entries, is a scathing portrait of one of England's most famous poets: a story of literary ambition and masculine egoism. Like all of Graves' historical novels, *The Story of Marie Powell, Wife to John Milton* is also a brilliant account of one of the most breathtaking epochs in English history, ravaged by a bloody civil war that culminated in the dramatic execution of Charles I and the establishment of a republic.

Preeminent English poet, novelist, critic, translator, and scholar of classical mythology **ROBERT GRAVES** (1895–1985) served in World War I—an experience recounted in his 1929 autobiography, *Goodbye to All That* (1929)—and later became the first professor of English literature at the University of Cairo. Other notable works include *I, Claudius* (1934), *The Golden Fleece* (1944), and *The White Goddess* (1948).

Croatian author, translator, and publisher **IVAN SRŠEN** started translating Robert Graves's prose into Croatian in 2010, with the autobiography *Goodbye to All That*. He also translated Graves's historical novels *King Jesus* and *They Hanged My Saintly Billy*. He is the author of several books, including *Harmattan* (2023)

The iconic Italian author Robert Saviano's latest work of nonfiction urges people to stand up for themselves and to not be fooled by the coercive nature of political power. Featuring short biographical sketches of those who have most inspired him—Russian poet Anna Akhmatova, Martin Luther King Jr., Edward Snowden, the Calipygian Venus, immortalized in marble—alongside those whose actions were most deplorable—Nazi propaganda minister Joseph Goebbels and Rwandan radio host Kantano Habimana, who fomented the 1993–94 genocide there—*Shout It Out!* demands its readers to open their eyes and be outraged, curious, and principled. Connecting personal stories to broader historical trends and political movements, Saviano shows us the power of the individual in troubled times.

ROBERTO SAVIANO is the author of the international bestseller *Gomorrah* (2006)—an investigative book about the socioeconomic reality of organized crime in Camorra, Italy—which was awarded the 2010 European Book Prize. He was awarded the 2011 PEN/Pinter International Writer of Courage Award and the 2019 Oxfam Novib/PEN Award for Freedom of Expression for his bravery in speaking out against the Italian mafia. His other books include *ZeroZeroZero* (2013) and *Solo è il coraggio* (2022), among others.

ANNE MILANO APPEL has translated nearly four dozen books from Italian to English, including Pope Francis's *God is Young* (2018) and Giovanni Arpino's *Scent of a Woman* (2011), which won the 2024 John Florio Prize for Italian Translation.

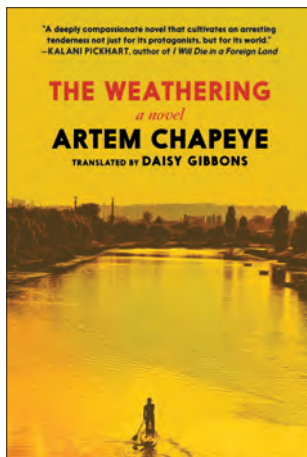

They’re encouraged to collect arms, too, as protection against the survivors of a neighboring island, though they are never quite sure what wrong those islanders have committed or what danger they pose. As tensions rise, the couple look to create community in the face of an uncertain future.

ARTEM CHAPEYE is the author of *The Ukraine* (Seven Stories, 2024), which was a finalist for the 2019 BBC Book of the Year Award for Nonfiction, and *Ordinary People Don’t Carry Machine Guns* (Seven Stories, 2024). A five-time finalist for the BBC Ukraine Book of the Year Award, Chapeye was also a finalist of the Kurt Schork Award in International Journalism.

The Fight Game in Black and White is an extraordinary history of boxing from the perspective of Ray Scott, one of America's outstanding Black athletes and coaches. From Peter Jackson—a free-born Black tradesman and boxer who KO'd the white boxer Tom Leeds to win the Australian Heavyweight championship in 1886—to Cassius Clay, who would later rename himself Muhammad Ali and come to dominate the sport for decades, this book charts dozens of Black boxers who fought from the late 1800s to the end of the 20th century. *The Fight Game in Black and White* shows how racism victimized Black boxers at the same time the sport provided an opportunity to transcend and overcome racist boundaries.

Philly native **JOHN RAYMOND “RAY” SCOTT** is the author of *The NBA in Black and White: The Memoir of a Trailblazing NBA Player and Coach* with Charley Rosen (Seven Stories, 2022). He was chosen as the fourth pick in the 1961 NBA draft by the Detroit Pistons and spent six years playing as a stand-out rebounder and deadly shooter from the perimeter. In October 1972, Scott was promoted from Assistant to Head Coach of the Detroit Pistons, and two years later he was named NBA Coach of the Year, becoming the first African American to win the award.

CHARLEY ROSEN (1941–2025) was basketball's most respected writer of fiction and nonfiction. He is the author of the novel *The House of Moses All-Stars* (Seven Stories, 1996), a *New York Times* Notable Book, and most recently, the bildungsroman *Dribbling Basketball on the Road to Damascus* (Seven Stories, 2025), among many others.

He served as Prime Minister of Cuba from 1959 to 1976 and President from 1976 to 2008. Ideologically a Marxist–Leninist and Cuban nationalist, he also served as the First Secretary of the Communist Party of Cuba from 1961 until 2011.

A Biographical Introduction

ERNESTO CHE GUEVARA

During his 1965 mission to Congo and Ghana, Che Guevara immersed himself in the classic works of Marxism. He sought to draw lessons and inspiration from Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels by charting their intellectual and political evolution. With his tremendous grasp of theory and his own practical experience, Che considers how Marxism might apply to other countries after they achieve liberation from colonialism. Che himself has said, “The Cuban Revolution takes up Marx at the point where he put aside science to pick up his revolutionary rifle.”

ERNESTO GUEVARA (1928–1967) was a Marxist revolutionary, physician, author, guerrilla leader, diplomat, and military theorist. During his medical studies in Buenos Aires, he took a trip on an old motorcycle through all of Latin America, which became the basis for *The Motorcycle Diaries*. As a young man, he was radicalized during his travels across Latin America, witnessing the Bolivian revolution and, in 1954, the US-backed overthrow of the democratically elected Guatemalan government of Jacobo Arbenz. Forced to leave Guatemala, he went to Mexico City, where he met with exiled Cuban revolutionaries and Fidel Castro in 1955. Soon after, he enlisted in the Cuban revolutionary expedition to overthrow Cuban dictator Fulgencio Batista and after a fierce struggle, General Batista fled in 1959. Che became a leading member of the new government, and he was also a central leader of the political organization that in 1965 became the Communist Party of Cuba.

Cuba's greatest photographer captures the spirit of the Cuban Revolution—and of Cuba itself—in unforgettable images and text.

Korda's photographs and breathtaking reminiscences capture some of the 20th-century's greatest moments with unprecedented intimacy as no other book ever could or will.

In the first weeks of 1959, Korda joined the staff of the newly created daily newspaper of Cuba, *Revolución*. From that moment on, Korda documented the heady early days of revolutionary Cuba. When Fidel Castro visited the United States in April 1959, Korda went with him. When Castro visited the Soviet Union in 1963 and 1964. But Korda's greatest moment came on March 5, 1960, during a funeral ceremony for the victims of the sabotaged French freighter *La Coubre*, a ship carrying arms purchased by the Cuban military.

Korda was less than a dozen steps from the platform where Fidel Castro was addressing the crowd of mourners. There were foreign observers present, including Jean-Paul Sartre and Simone de Beauvoir. Che stepped forward to look over the crowd. Korda shot him through his telephoto lens, even though he was near to him. The result would turn into nothing less than one of the most enduring images of our age, though the picture would not see light of day for another year. It was first published on April 15, 1961, just before the Bay of Pigs invasion, and would only become well known when Che's Italian publisher Gianfranco Feltrinelli printed thousands of posters of the image shortly after Che's death.

ALBERTO KORDA (born Alberto Díaz Gutiérrez in Havana in 1928, the same year as Che) was Cuba's best known fashion photographer, and discovered several of Cuba's best known fashion models, paragons of beauty whom he photographed and in this way introduced a vision of Cuban glamour and stylishness. Then came the Cuban Revolutionary War, and from his Havana studio Korda became Cuba's best known photographer of the revolutionary period. Many of the iconic photographs of the new Cuba were taken by Korda, including the one of Che that captured his revolutionary spirit in such an extraordinarily natural and powerful way that it still stands as the iconic visual manifestation of revolutionary defiance.

CHRISTOPHE LOVINY is a French writer and photographer, and author of *Che: The Photobiography of Che Guevara*.

ALESSANDRA SILVESTRI-LEVY is an Italo-Brazilian art writer and curator and former International Executive Director for the Brazilian Cinema Foundation.

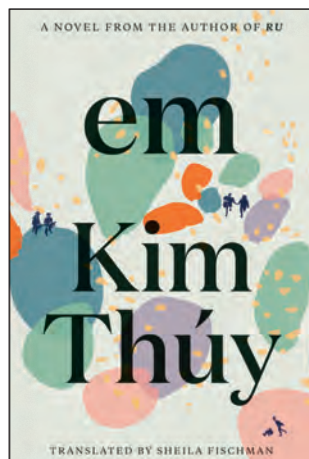

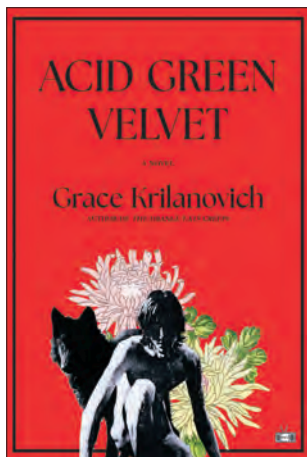

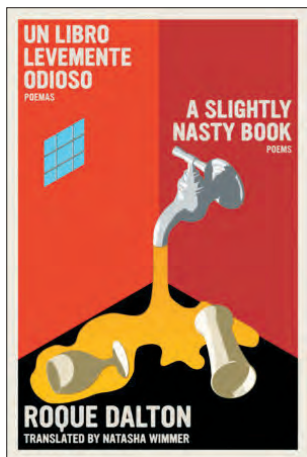

ROQUE DALTON

The Salvadoran poet and revolutionary Roque Dalton, an influential figure in Latin American history, posits a political approach to poetry and, conversely, a poetic approach to politics. This masterful posthumous collection features prose poems, as well as the metric and semantic novelty of mini-poems or, more specifically, one-word-to-a-line enumerations. The *I* of these poems is both martyr and cynic. Dalton's brand of revolutionary mysticism combines fierce satirical irony with an exuberant tenderness. As a poet who brilliantly fused politics and art, Dalton permanently changed the direction of Central American poetry.

ROQUE DALTON (1935–1975) was the author of eighteen volumes of poetry and prose, including *Taberna y otros lugares*, which received a Casa de las Américas prize in 1969. His legacy extends beyond his achievements as a poet to his political writings and political work in his native El Salvador. Dalton was murdered on May 10, 1975, four days before turning forty.

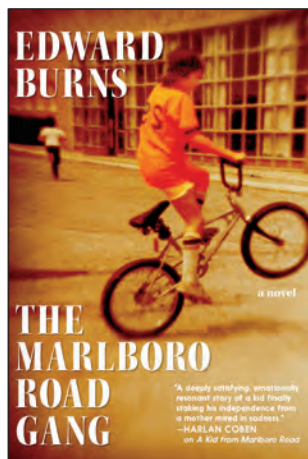
The Marlboro Road Gang

Burns's first film *The Brothers McMullen* won the Grand Jury Prize at the 1995 Sundance Film Festival and Best First Feature at the 1996 Independent Spirit Awards. His most recent film is *Millers in Marriage* (2024).

The anthology includes twenty-four previously unpublished writings by Ernaux as well as literary criticism, essays, and interviews by other contributors, a song by Jeanne Cherhal, newspaper clippings, a comic strip by Aurélia Aurita, and letters from Simone de Beauvoir. This visually stunning collection includes an 8-page color photo insert with images, handwritten manuscript pages, and drawings.

PIERRE-LOUIS FORT is a professor at CY Cergy Paris University. He is a specialist in 20th and 21st century French literature, and is also the author of essays including “Critique et Littérature” (Paris, 2008) and “Simone de Beauvoir” (Paris, 2016). He edited this book in collaboration with Ernaux herself. It was published in 2022 in France as *Cahier de L'Herne Annie Ernaux*.

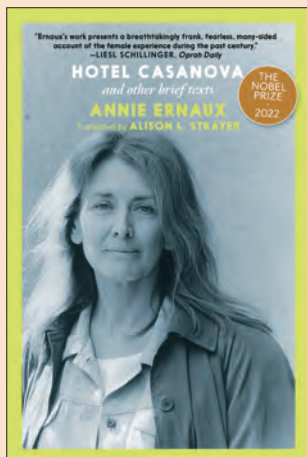

Then, in “Histories,” Ernaux recalls a time in her childhood when she was the older girl responsible for a younger neighbor, holding her hand and bringing her to school and then home again, and the feelings of loss that ensued when this ended. These personal narratives are joined by journalistic essays on such themes as the relationship between literature and politics, discourses on Cesare Pavese and Pierre Bourdieu, travel journals of Moscow, Leningrad, Leipzig, along with personal essays on writing and other subjects. All of these texts comprise the song of a considered life.

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One of the most neglected American writers and also one of the best loved, **NELSON ALGREN** (1909–1981) believed that “literature is made upon any occasion that a challenge is put to the legal apparatus by conscience in touch with humanity.” The recipient of the first National Book Award for Fiction and lauded by Hemingway as “one of the two best authors in America,” Algren remains among America’s most defiant and enduring novelists. His work includes several major novels, *Never Come Morning* (1945), *The Man with the Golden Arm* (1949), *A Walk on the Wild Side* (1956), two short fiction collections, *The Neon Wilderness* (1947) and *The Last Carousel* (1973), a book-length prose-poem, *Chicago: City on the Make* (1951), and several collections of reportage. Algren died on May 9, 1981, within days of his appointment as a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Letters.

ALAN SINGER is a social studies educator and historian at Hofstra University, and a former New York City high school teacher. He is the author of many books including *Social Studies for Secondary Schools: 5th Edition* and *Teaching Climate History*.

IMANI HINSON is a high school social studies teacher in Howard County, Maryland. She has co-produced work on African American history in New York for the New Jersey Council for Social Studies. She is a curriculum reviewer for the College Board AP African American Studies program.

Adapted by Rebecca Stefoff, and including maps, photos, and other visuals, *The Rediscovery of America for Young People* is an essential resource for teachers and students that combats the erasure of Native peoples from US history, telling a fuller and truer account of America. This book acknowledges the enduring power, agency, and survival of Indigenous peoples, revealing anew the varied meanings of America.

NED BLACKHAWK (Western Shoshone) is the Howard R. Lamar Professor of History and American Studies at Yale University and the faculty coordinator for the Yale Group for the Study of Native America. His 2023 book *The Rediscovery of America* won the 2023 National Book Award, the 2024 Anisfield-Wolf Award, and the 2024 Mark Lynton History Prize. He is also the author of *Violence over the Land: Indians and Empires in the Early American West* (2006).

REBECCA STEFOFF has devoted her career to writing histories, literary biographies, and landmark works of science for young readers. She has adapted several best-selling history books for younger readers, including Howard Zinn’s masterpiece, published as *A Young People’s History of the United States* (2009).



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Against the Tide

Inspired by the true story of a young Palestinian girl named Madelein Callab, *Against the Tide* follows fifteen-year-old Yusra who supports her struggling family by becoming the first ever fisherwoman in Gaza. One day, when Yusra accidentally goes past the designated three-mile zone where she is allowed to fish, she encounters the Israeli navy and must stand up for herself and negotiate a peaceful solution. *Against the Tide* is not only a story of resilience but also a lesson on how the courage and ingenuity of one person can transform the world.

TAGHREED NAJJAR is a Palestinian-Jordanian author of over fifty books for children and young adults, including *Watermelon Madness* (2018) and *My Brother and Me* (2019). She has been awarded the Etisalat Prize for Arabic Children's Literature for her young adult novel *Whose Doll Is This?*, and was shortlisted three times for the same prize. She is also the founder of Dar al-Salwa, an independent publishing house dedicated to publishing Arabic children's and young adult books.

Executive director of Words Without Borders **ELISABETH JAQUETTE**'s translation of Adania Shibli's *Minor Detail* (2017) was a finalist for the National Book Award in Translated Literature and longlisted for the International Booker Prize.

AYA GHANAMEH is the author and illustrator of the picture book *These Olive Trees* (2023) and the illustrator of Jenan A. Matari's *Everything Grows in Jiddo's Garden* (2025).

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Augustine of Hippo

The Longings of a Restless Heart

DEVRA LEHMANN

In a time when Christianity was just finding its footing on the world stage, Augustine of Hippo left his permanent imprint on the religion and consequently on all of Western civilization. Here, Lehmann constructs an accessible narrative of the seminal thinker and theologian who wrote the *Confessions* and *City of God*. Augustine, who served as the bishop of Hippo from 396 C.E. until his death in 430 C.E., spoke of a radical and inescapable dependence on the unfathomable will of God. Augustine comes to life in this biography—his childhood in the north African town of Thagaste, his adult years as a Manichean and teacher in Africa and Italy, his conversion to Catholicism under the guidance of Ambrose, the bishop of Milan, and his rise to prominence with his enduring synthesis of Christianity and Neoplatonism. Augustine's views on creation, original sin, divine grace, and the Trinity remain pillars of Christian theology, and his reflections on language, time, memory, and war have had a profound impact on the field of philosophy.

A classroom teacher of almost four decades **DEVRA LEHMANN** is the author of *Socrates: A Life Worth Living* (Seven Stories, 2022), which was named a Best Teen & YA Nonfiction title of 2022 by Kirkus Reviews, and *Spinoza: The Outcast Thinker* (2014; Seven Stories, 2024), which won the 2014 National Jewish Book Award for Children's and Young Adult Literature.



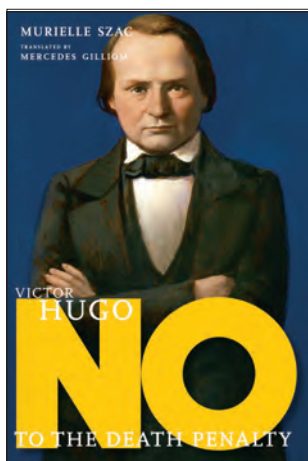

No to the Death Penalty

When poet and novelist Victor Hugo was a child in early 1800s France, it was common to walk down the street and see a petty thief or vagrant beheaded at the guillotine. Hugo was sickened and haunted by these public executions. For him, no man has the right or the power to end the life of another, whatever the crime committed. Presently, many activists have taken up the fight to end the death penalty, and much progress has been made around the world, despite many countries—China, Iran, Egypt, the United States, among others—refusing the call to abolish the death penalty as a form of state-sanctioned punishment. A new addition to the “They Said No” series, *Victor Hugo: No to the Death Penalty* plunges us into the heart of Victor Hugo’s fierce fight against the death penalty.

MURIELLE SZAC is a journalist and writer. She has been a political journalist as well as the editor-in-chief of three magazines about early childhood. In 2008 Murielle created the “They Said No” (*“Ceux qui ont dit non”*) series for Actes Sud Jeunesse, which she currently directs.

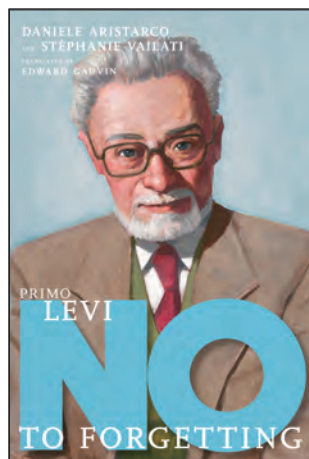
The Italian chemist and resistance fighter Primo Levi emerged from the hell of the Auschwitz concentration camp at the age of 25. As a testament to survival, he wrote what have become some of the most wrenching yet life-affirming books ever written about the Holocaust experience. Levi, who died in 1987, devoted his life to maintaining our collective memory of the Holocaust—insisting that we acknowledge and remember what happened so future generations never forget. *Primo Levi: No to Forgetting* is a new addition to the “They Said No” series, and the only book about Primo Levi for readers age 12 and up.

“Never forget that this has happened/Remember these words.” Primo Levi’s goal was to never let people forget the rise of Fascism and the Holocaust—so that it would never happen again.

DANIELE ARISTARCO was born in Naples in 1977. He is a screenwriter, director, and has taught literature. His children’s books, translated into several languages, tell young readers about history, most recently related to literature and the cinema.

STÉPHANIE VAILATI studied scientific journalism in Paris. She is an author, translator and illustrator of texts for children.

EDWARD GAUVIN has translated in various fields from film to fiction, with a personal focus on contemporary comics and post-Surrealist literature of the fantastic. He was a 2021 Guggenheim fellow.

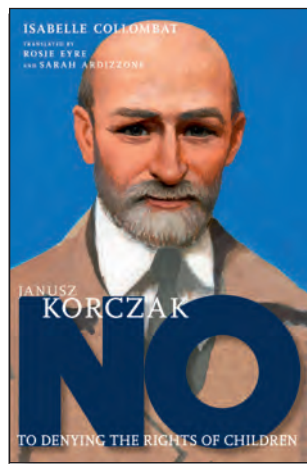

His work inspired the U.N. Convention on the Rights of the Child, and will compel readers to reconsider the status and welfare and agency of every child.

She often mixes in her books individual destinies and great movements of History. She has published many historical novels in the series “They Said No.”

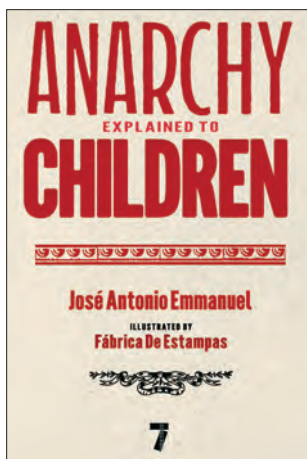

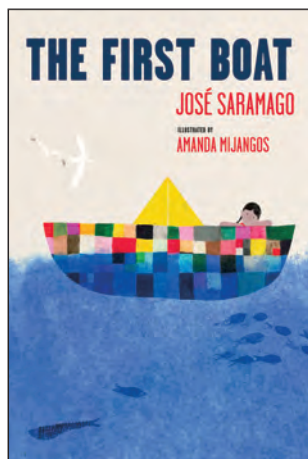

Escrito, al igual que *Diarios de motocicleta*, en su mayoría en formato de diario, *Pasajes* es “más distintivo, refinado” en su estilo, así observa su hija, Aleida Guevara, en su prólogo, pero todavía mantiene ese “joven destello y dinamismo”.

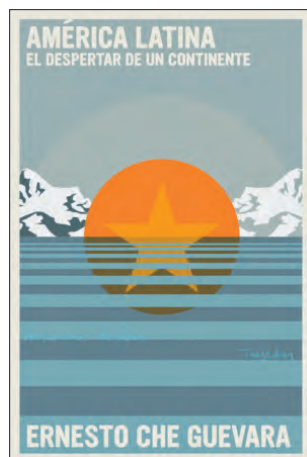

A medida que el Che documenta sus primeros viajes por América Latina, su participación en la revolución guatemalteca y la revolución cubana, y su ascenso a la prominencia internacional bajo el mando de Fidel Castro, vemos cómo su ferviente compromiso con la justicia social moldeó y fue moldeado por el continente al que llamó su hogar.

Investigadora mundialmente reconocida y experta en la obra de Ernesto Che Guevara, **MARÍA DEL CARMEN ARIET GARCÍA** tuvo un papel importante en la investigación que en 1997 condujo al hallazgo de los restos del Che en Bolivia. Actualmente es la coordinadora del Centro de Estudios Che Guevara, en La Habana.



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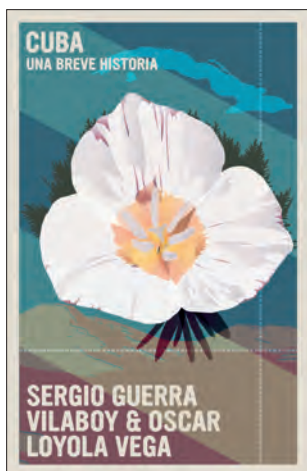
