CRCA Rowing National Rankings

Since 2002, Virginia leads all Atlantic Coast Conference schools with 90 appearances in the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association poll. The Cavaliers have appeared in 54 consecutive polls, dating back to the final CRCA poll of 2006. The Cavaliers have actually made an appearance in 90 of 91 CRCA polls since 2002. Clemson is next with 45 total appearances, including a streak of 42 consecutive polls which ended on April 18, 2012. Duke is the only other ACC school to make an appearance in the CRCA national poll, having made six appearances, but none since the 2005 season. Virginia, in 2010, became the first ACC team to be ranked No. 1 nationally, earning that ranking three times in 2010, the first of which occurred in the poll of April 7. Virginia was also ranked first in the final poll of the year on May 19 prior to winning the team title at the NCAA Championships. The Cavaliers achieved six more No. 1 national rankings in 2012, in the first five polls and in the final poll. UVa was ranked No. 1 in the first poll of both the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Steve Fiske enters his 14th season as head coach and program director of rowing at Boston College. Fiske came to The Heights in 1999, prior to the program's final year as a club sport at BC. Fiske enjoyed immediate success in the Eagles' inaugural season, winning a Dad Vail Championship, including a victory in the women's Varsity Eight, and consequently earning selection as Division I New England Coach of the Year in 2001. During his tenure at the helm, Fiske's teams have shown consistent speed and progress, highlighted by wins in a number of prestigious regattas, including the Dad Vail Championship, the Big East Championship, the New England Rowing Championship, and the Knecht Cup. In 2005, BC's final year in the Big East Conference, Fiske earned Big East Coach of the Year honors after guiding the rowing team to a second place finish at the conference championship, the best finish in program history. Fisk has guided the Eagles to a fourth-place finish in the ACC Championships in each of the past three years. Prior to coaching at Boston College, Fiske served as an assistant coach for six years at his alma mater, Fordham University. His teams at Fordham won medals in a number of championship regattas, including the Atlantic 10 Championships, the Dad Vail Regatta and the International Rowing Association (IRA) Regatta. Fiske competed intercollegiately at Fordham and was a member of some of the university's most successful crews. He rowed with the 1992 Fordham four that won a bronze medal in the IRA Regatta and advanced to the quarterfinals of the Henley Royal Regatta.

Robbie Tenenbaum is in the fourth full season at Clemson and his third year as Head Coach with the Tigers. He led Clemson to a 2nd-place finish in the 2011 and 2012 ACC Championships and a 15th-place national finish at the 2011 NCAA Championships. Clemson's First Varsity Four boat captured the 2012 ACC title. He came to Clemson from the University of Miami, where he served for two years as the Head Women's Rowing Coach. Prior to his stint at Miami, he was an assistant coach at the University of Washington for the 2006-2007 season, where he helped lead the Washington Huskies to a top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships. Tenenbaum was an assistant coach at Ohio State from 1998-2006 where he earned the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association's (CRCA) award for Assistant Coach of the Year in 2006. He received back-to-back CRCA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2005 and 2006. Under his instruction at Ohio State, the second varsity eight finished fourth in the Grand Final in both the 2005 and 2006 NCAA Championships. Tenenbaum helped guide the Ohio State first varsity four to a sixth-place finish at the 2004 NCAA Championships and a fourth-place finish in 2003. In addition to university coaching, Tenenbaum was an assistant coach for the United States Junior National Rowing Team from 1996-2001. Tenenbaum has held head coaching positions at Tulsa (1997-98), Florida Tech (1994-95), and with the Clemson Club program (1993-94) as well as being the assistant women's coach at Tennessee from 1995-1997. A native of Shaker Heights, Ohio, Tenenbaum earned a marketing degree from Tampa in 1992.

Head coach Robyn Horner enters her 15th season at the helm of the Duke rowing program after being named the university's first rowing coach on July 1, 1998. After starting the program from scratch during the 1998-99 academic year, Horner has turned the team into a perennial ACC Championship contender as evidenced by top-three finishes in 11 of the last 12 conference finals, including a stretch of eight consecutive during the 2001-08 seasons. Her 2012 First Varsity Eight crew finished 2nd at the ACC Championship. She has coached five All-America selections--including 2011 2nd-team CRCA All-America Alex Japhet--and 18 student-athletes who went on to receive All-ACC honors, including Emily Theys (All-ACC in 2011 and 2012), who returns to this year's Duke team after capturing all-conference honors and first-team CRCA All-South Region honors. A total of 15 Blue Devils were named to the All-ACC Academic Rowing teams the past two years including a school-record 8 in 2011. Horner has twice been named ACC Coach of the Year, most recently in 2006 when she led the program to a second-place finish at the ACC Championships. She also took home the ACC Coach of the Year award in 2002 along with South Region Coach of the Year honors after her Blue Devils earned a spot among the national top-20 throughout the entire season. Duke's success was not just limited to the ACC Championship in 2008, as the Blue Devils also pulled out an upset over 10th-ranked Michigan's varsity four at the ACC-Big 10 Challenge and swept all eight races at the Invitational on Lake Wheeler. Horner came to Duke after an impressive two-year stint as the head women's coach at Williams College in Massachusetts. Horner led Williams to the No. 1 ranking both in the 1996-97 and the 1997-98 seasons. Prior to her two seasons at Williams, Horner led Minnesota's novice squad to two Dad Vail championships. Her teams also claimed four medals at Collegiate Nationals.

Andrew Carter begins his fourth season as head rowing coach at the University of Miami bringing more than 20 years of coaching experience both on the collegiate and international level. Though limited by depth issues in his first three years with the Hurricanes, he guided Miami to a 4th-place team ACC finish in 2011 and a 4th-place effort in the First Varsity 8 competition in 2012. Carter came to UM from Clemson, where he spent the 2008-09 season as an assistant coach with the Tigers' program. With the Tigers, Carter helped Clemson achieve a No. 9 national ranking along with eight top-three finishes during the fall season, as well as helping the Tigers claim their first Atlantic Coast Conference Championship. With the ACC crown, the Clemson earned its first NCAA Championships team appearance. Carter personally coached the Tigers' NCAA Champion Varsity 4+ crew at the 2009 NCAA Championships. Throughout his career, Carter has won more than 50 championship medals as a coach, in addition to coaching seven All-Americans and 17 National Scholar-Athletes in just the past 10 years alone. Prior to joining the Clemson program, he spent eight seasons (2000-08) as head coach at Bates College, one year as an assistant coach at Southern California (2000) and four years as head coach at Vassar College (1996-99).

Sarah Haney, who has played key roles at every level of the UNC rowing program, begins her 11th season as the Tar Heels' head coach. After serving as an assistant coach during the 2001-02 season, when she directed the Carolina novice squad, Haney was promoted to the program's top position on July 19, 2002. Haney, a 1998 graduate of UNC, helped lobby for the rowing program's elevation to varsity status at North Carolina and lettered on the school's first varsity squad in 1997-98. She served as a volunteer assistant coach at UNC in the fall of 1998 while completing her undergraduate degree. Upon graduating with a double major in English and exercise and sports science, she joined the Carolina staff on a full-time basis for the spring of 1999. She then spent two years at the University of Wisconsin as assistant coach of the lightweight women's team. Her novices won the Eastern Sprints championship in 2000 and finished second in 2001. Haney returned to UNC as an assistant coach in July of 2001 and directed the team's novice rowers that year. A native of Southern Pines, N.C., Haney is a graduate of Pinecrest High School, where she captained the volleyball, basketball and softball teams and played on a state championship volleyball team. She began rowing as a North Carolina sophomore and captained the UNC club team in 1996 and 1997.

Named National Coach of the Year for the second time in his career, Kevin Sauer, now in his 18th year as head coach of Virginia's rowing program, has guided the Cavaliers to become one of the elite women's rowing programs in the nation. UVa is one of just four schools to compete in at least 13 NCAA Women's Rowing Championships, finishing in the top four 10 times including capturing the 2012 and 2010 NCAA National Rowing Championships. Sauer has been in charge of the UVa women's rowing program since its inception as a varsity sport in the fall of 1995. Before that, he coached both the men's and women's club teams at the University since 1988. Due in large part to Sauer's tireless devotion to Virginia women's rowing, the Cavaliers made an immediate impact at the Division I level. In just its second season of varsity competition in 1997, Virginia finished fourth at the inaugural NCAA Championships. The following year, UVa's second varsity eight finished first at the 1998 NCAA Championships, leading the Cavaliers to a third-place finish overall. At the 1999 NCAA's, the second varsity eight defended its national title and the Cavaliers tied for first overall but were awarded the second-place trophy by virtue of a tie-breaker. Virginia won silver medals in both the varsity eight and varsity four races at the championship regatta. The winningest rowing coach in ACC history, Sauer has directed the Cavaliers to 12 of the 13 ACC Rowing titles, including the first nine from 2000 through 2008. He has been named ACC Coach of the Year on eight occasions including the last three seasons (2010, 2011 and 2012). A native of Indianapolis, Ind., Sauer served two stints as head coach at Purdue (1979-82, 86-87) and was freshman coach at Yale (1983-85) prior to coming to UVa. He has helped develop 30 All-Americans at Virginia and 44 All-ACC selections. He has also been a successful coach on the international scene and two of his former UVa rowers, Lindsay Shoop (gold) and Melanie Kok (bronze) captured medals at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games.

Virginia Captures Second National Championship Wahoos Take First Varsity Eight Title

WEST WINDSOR, N.J.—Virginia's First Varsity Eight won the grand final to clinch the Cavaliers' second NCAA team Rowing Championship on Sunday, May 27, 2012, on Mercer Lake in West Windsor, N.J. The win in the First Varsity Eight was the first of any ACC team in the national championship.

The national rowing title was the second for Coach Kevin Sauer's Rowing team in three years. UVa won the 2010 title and finished 6th in 2011.

The Cavaliers finished with 87 points, while Michigan placed second with 82 points. California was third with 78, just ahead of Princeton, which had 77.

"It feels great," head coach Kevin Sauer said. "I was just thinking, 'Come on you guys, do what you are capable to do.' I told them before the race to remember who they are and what they want and they just went out and did it. They were tight in the beginning and were a little behind, but they were patient and in the second thousand (meters), they were awesome."

Trailing California by three points going into the 1V8 grand final, the Cavaliers held off Michigan and won by nearly a full boat length in 6:18.72. The Wolverines were second in 6:22.09, while USC was third in 6:25.06. It is first time UVa has won the First Varsity Eight title.

Virginia, which was seeded first in the First Varsity Eight coming into the regatta, was second to Michigan after 250 meters, but had taken the lead by the 750-meter mark. Halfway through the race, the Cavaliers had a five-seat lead over Michigan and by the finish, were almost leading by open water.

"For the last month or two, we felt we had a shot, but it had to be a team performance," associate head coach Steve Pritzker said. "We knew the Fours (First Varsity Four) had to be at the top. We knew the 2V8 had to make the grand final and they did that. I think its great that even though those two boats didn't win, they can see what a great part they played in this team championship."

In the Varsity Four, the Cavaliers jumped out to a five-seat lead over Ohio State by 500 meters, but the Buckeyes overcame UVa at the end and won the race in a time of 7:13.09 to Virginia's time of 7:15.18. California placed third in 7:21.15, while Yale (7:23.53), Princeton (7:26.23) and Washington (7:29.20) rounded out the final.

The Varsity Four finished second for the second consecutive year and the fifth time overall. Virginia has won four previous Varsity Four national titles (2004, 2005, 2007, 2010).

In the Second Varsity Eight, Michigan won in a time of 6:37.04, ahead of Ohio State (6:38.94) and Cal (6:40.85). Virginia placed fifth in 6:44.97, behind Princeton (6:42.61) but before UCLA (7:10.40).

"This is more than I could have ever asked for," senior co-captain Sarah Borchelt said. "The best part is that we had almost the entire team here cheering us on. Every day, every race, the ups and downs and the blood, sweat and tears we shed was all worth it."

Virginia Captures 2012 ACC Rowing Championship In Come-From-Behind Fashion

Cavaliers Drop First Race But Win Final Three Events

Clemson, S.C.—Virginia, the nation's No. 1-ranked Rowing team, captured the 2012 Atlantic Coast Conference Rowing Championship on April 21, winning on the final race of the day, the First Varsity Eight, edging host Clemson on Lake Hartwell.

In doing so, the Cavaliers took their third straight ACC Rowing title and their 12th in the 13 years of the event. Clemson is the only other ACC team to have captured a league Rowing title, doing so in 2009.

The event was held in front of a record Rowing Championship crowd of approximately 1,100 fans with calm winds and a temperature of 61 degrees.

Virginia totaled 56 points, followed by Clemson with 52, Duke (39), Boston College (27), North Carolina (18) and Miami (17).

After the championship, in a vote by the ACC coaches, Miami's Hannah Hawks (Mooresville, N.C.) was named ACC Freshman of the Year.

"Hannah Hawks has had a fantastic season for us as a freshman," said Miami head coach Andrew Carter. "In my eyes, she's not capable of making a poor decision. She sat squarely in our top boat as a freshman. She's shown great leadership throughout the year and set a very positive tone for the future of our program."

Virginia head coach Kevin Sauer was named ACC Coach of the Year, his third straight ACC Coach of the Year honor and eighth overall.

"This is never old hat," said Sauer. "Every championship is worthy and a lot of fun. The student-athletes did a real fine job today. Clemson did a fantastic job in the Four and really rallied there. But our other boats did a good job.

"Everybody stepped up and raced. The Novices, the 2-V's

and the First Varsity Eight all had good wins.

"I'm honored to be named Coach of the Year, but that has more to do with Associate Head Coach Steve Pritzker, Josh Gautrea, our graduate assistant coach; Matt Purcell and the kids. That's how you get a coach of the year award; the efforts of all of those people."

The Cavaliers and Tigers came into the final race of the day—the First Varsity Eight—tied with 32 points each after Clemson took an early lead by winning the First varsity Four competition.

But Virginia's First Varsity Eight crew took the pivotal race in convincing fashion posting a time of 6:27.9 to outdistance the Tigers, who finished second with a time of 6:38.6.

Clemson had opened the day with an impressive win in the First Varsity Four race behind the crew of coxswain Carissa Richardson (St. Catherine's, Ontario, Canada); Taylor Hoynacki (Tega Cay, S.C.); Katie Mosier (Piscataway, N.J.); Rebekah Clogston, Sr. (Snohomish, Wash.); and Kenzie DuBrul (Cincinnati, Ohio), posting a time of 7:37.9 to defeat second-place Duke (7:46.6) and third-place Virginia (7:47.1).

The Tigers win in the First Varsity Four marked only the 5th time Virginia has lost an event in the 13-year history of the ACC Championships.

All five Cavaliers members of the UVA's National Champion First Varsity Eight boat and all five were named to the CRCA first team led by UVA coxswain Sidney Thorsten (Atlanta, Ga.) but also including Keziah Beall (Bainbridge, Island, Wash.), Sarah Cowburn (Redditch, Worcester, England), Martie Kuzzy (Minneapolis, Minn.) and Kristine O'Brien (Massapequa Park, N.Y.). All five UVA rowers were key contributors to a Virginia program which has captured two NCAA National Championships in the past three years. They were joined by Clemson's Heather Cummings (Virginia Beach, Va.), who was named to the CRCA Second team for the Tigers, who finished the year ranked 20th nationally in the final CRCA poll. The honor was the second for Thorsten, who earned second-team CRCA All-America honors in 2010 after guiding UVA to their first national championship, and for O'Brien, who earned first-team honors in 2011 when Virginia finished

6th in the NCAA National Championships. Cummings earned All-America honors for the first time, joining her older sister Brittany, who was a first-team All-America for the Tigers in 2010 and a second-team selection in 2009.

Thorsten, Beall, Cowburn, and Kuzzy were all seniors for the Cavaliers this past year, while O'Brien and Cummings were juniors.

UVA's Kevin Sauer Named 2012 National Coach of the Year

CRCA Tabs Sauer for Second Time for National Honor

Virginia Head Coach Kevin Sauer, who guided Virginia to its second national NCAA championship in three years, was named the 2012 Pocock National Coach of the Year by the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA). Sauer just completed his 17th year at the helm of Virginia Women's Rowing. He led his team to a first place team showing at the NCAA Rowing Championships this past May, winning the Varsity 8, finishing fifth in the Second Varsity 8, and finishing second in the Varsity Four. In all, Sauer has guided UVA to 10 NCAA finishes of fourth or better. In 1999, Sauer led Virginia to a first-place tie, but the Cavaliers were awarded 2nd place by virtue of a tie-breaker. Earlier this year Sauer led Virginia to its 12th ACC Rowing title in 13 years and also captured team honors at the Easter Sprints Regatta. Sauer was previously honored as National Coach of the Year in 2010 and has been named ACC Coach of the Year eight times.



Borchelt Named to Capital One Academic All-America First Team

Senior was co-captain for 2012 national champion Cavaliers

Virginia rowing senior Sarah Borchelt (Sterling, Mass.) was named to the 2012 Capital One Academic All-America Women's At-Large First Team, the Collegiate Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Borchelt, a two-year co-captain, helped the Cavaliers to capture the 2012 NCAA Championship in May. She was a part of the Second Varsity Eight that finished fifth at the national regatta and won the ACC Championship in April. She was named to the Capital One Academic All-District III Women's At-Large First Team on May 18. The senior was named the 2011 ACC Rowing Scholar-Athlete of the Year and twice was named a Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA) National Scholar-Athlete. She graduated in May with a degree in nursing with a 3.92 GPA.

Virginia Captures NCAA Rowing Championship

Cavaliers Claim First ACC National Rowing Title

Clemson Earned 15th-Place National Finish

May 30, 2010

GOLD RIVER, Calif. – For the first time in the 11 years the Atlantic Coast Conference has sponsored Rowing, an ACC team captured the National Championship as Virginia, the No. 1-ranked Rowing team, captured the 2010 NCAA Rowing Championship with 87 points at Lake Natoma at the Sacramento State Aquatic Center, outdistancing second-place California, which had 82 points.

UVa's First Varsity Four capped off an undefeated season by winning its race and being crowned national champions.

Clemson finished 15th, giving the ACC two schools among the top 15 in the country.

The Tigers' First Varsity Eight boat won the Third Final, while Clemson's First Varsity Four boat finished fourth in the Petite Final.

The team victory gave Virginia its 20th team National Championship in school history.

The Cavaliers were led by their Varsity Four, which handily captured the event title and which had earlier set NCAA records for the event, and by their First Varsity Eight crew which finished a close second to national champion Yale, finishing less than a second behind the Elis.

Virginia's Varsity Four became the seventh crew in school history to win a national championship and the

first since 2007.

The win was also the sixth national event title by an ACC school since the Conference began sponsoring rowing for the 2000 season.

UVa's crew of coxswain Sarah Pichardo (Clifton, Va.), Ruth Retzinger (Cincinnati, Ohio), Hunter Terry (Greenwich, Conn.), Chelsea Simpson (Carlisle, Pa.) and Inge Janssen (Voorburg, The Netherlands), had set an NCAA record in the semifinals on Saturday with a time of 7:07.28 and finished more than four seconds in front of second-place California.

"This is a special feeling," Virginia head coach Kevin Sauer said. "It's unbelievable. We have worked so hard at this. It's a great, great feeling."

The win in the First Varsity Four marked the second straight year an ACC team has captured the national championship in this event. Last year, Clemson captured the national title in the First Varsity Four.

Virginia's 2010 Varsity Four did not lose a race during the spring season and won the ACC Championship race in addition to the NCAA Championship race. It became the first UVa crew to win a national championship since the 2007 Varsity Four.

"They were a dominant crew from day one here," Sauer said. "Associate head coach Steve Pritzker did a great job with those guys. They rowed well and they

"I feel amazing right now," Virginia senior Jennifer Cromwell said. "This is honestly a dream come true. When I committed to Virginia, I made a promise to myself that I was not leaving here without a national championship. So now it is a dream come true. My last race being a Cavalier, I can't put into words how excited I am."
